Synopsis

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Jacob Jansky of the Wisconsin (WI) Department of Justice (DOJ) – Division of Criminal Justice (DCI) was requested to investigate an Officer Involved Shooting in Mequon, Wisconsin (WI). SAC Jansky was informed of the incident via phone call and was advised that the crime scene located at 3119 W. Bonniwell Road, Mequon, WI.

SAC Jansky informed Special Agent (SA) Shannon Jones of the incident and requested that he respond directly to the crime scene.

SA Jones responded to the scene and determined that there were three (3) Mequon Police Department (MUPD) Patrol Officers involved. The Patrol Officers were separated and conveyed to MUPD.

SA Jones also discovered that the decedent (Pietro La Licata, W/M, [REDACTED]) was still located at the crime scene.

SA Jones recommends that a case be opened and used as a repository for any evidence obtained during this investigation.

Synopsis

On 5/17/23 DFE Ruff was called out to an officer involved in a critical incident that occurred in Mequon Wisconsin. At approximately 8:00PM DFE Ruff observed Mequon Police Officer Sean Kilpatrick place body worn cameras in their docking stations to upload the video to the Motorola cloud portal. DFE Ruff subsequently followed Officer Kilpatrick to a workstation and observed as it was downloaded from the Motorola cloud portal. It should be noted that DFE Villegas observed the docking of additional body worn cameras, which will be documented by him. Upon completion of the downloads, DFE Ruff provided Officer Kilpatrick with a formatted thumb drive so the downloaded videos could be retrieved.

While observing the downloaded body worn camera video DFE Ruff was informed that drone footage was also needing to be retrieved. DFE Ruff connected with the Drone operator [REDACTED] and he removed a 64GB Samsung EVO SD card from his drone and gave it to DFE Ruff. DFE Ruff then connected the device to the forensic workstation through a Cellebrite write blocking card reader and imaged it using UFED for PC to gain a logical image of it. Once the extraction was acquired it was parsed using Physical Analyzer.

After gaining the body camera footage and the drone video, DFE Ruff drove to the decedents residents to look at a security camera system. Upon arriving DFE Ruff noted six cameras mounted to outside the residents, which were physically wired under drywall to a Network Video Recorder DVR system with S/N: [REDACTED] which was mounted to a wall inside the house. DFE Ruff attempted to recover the video from the DVR however the device was pattern locked. For this reason, DFE Ruff removed the device from the wall.

On 5/17/23 DFE Ruff removed a 2TB Seagate Skyhawk Surveillance HDD from the device and attempted to recover video using DVR Examiner, however the file system used was not supported. Thus, DFE Ruff reassembled the drive and attempted to recover video through the systems GUI. It should be noted that DFE Ruff was informed that a family member of the decedent knew the code and it was [REDACTED] or in pattern form [REDACTED]. After entering the GUI DFE Ruff noted that no video was stored, and the device appeared to only be set to show live footage with no recordings. To confirm this DFE Ruff removed the drive and connected it to X-Ways forensic software.

On 5/19/23 DFE Ruff was informed that the original 911 call extraction disk which had been given to agents did not work. Thus, DFE Ruff contacted Ozaukee County Communication Division Manager Heather Boesch to collect a working copy. Upon retrieving the device DFE Ruff noted that the flash drive that was given to him had working copies of the 911 call, dispatch calls, body camera footage from Saukville police and a CAD report. The original thumb drive was given to Special Agent Chihak to be placed into evidence. It should be noted that all of this along with the Mequon body worn camera footage and drone footage were placed into the DCIR folder labeled DFU Response under this supplement number.

On 05/17/2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice/Division of Criminal Investigation (WI-DOJ/DCI) Special Agent (SA) Ann Shaw was requested to process the scene and collect evidence at 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd., Mequon, WI 53097.

SYNOPSIS

On 5/17/2023, at approximately 3:13PM, law enforcement personnel from the City of Mequon Police Department were dispatched to 3119 Bonniwell Rd, in the City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin for a report of a subject who shot at his neighbor, while the neighbor was mowing their lawn. Law enforcement subsequently made contact with the suspect, Pietro Lalicata, at his residence 3119 Bonniwell Rd. Lalicata shot at law enforcement, and law enforcement returned fire, which resulted in Lalicata's death.

On 5/17/2023, Mequon PD contacted WI-DOJ/DCI and requested assistance with the investigation of the officer involved death (OID) investigation. On 5/17/2023, SA Shaw responded to the scene, located at 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd. and assisted the WI-DOJ State Crime Laboratory (WSCL) Crime Response Unit (CRSU) with the documentation and processing of the scene. Prior to SA Shaw's arrival, SA Shannon Jones, SA Scott Marlock and SA Neil McGrath were on scene assisted with the processing and search of the residence.

SCENE CONTROL/SECURITY

Control and security of the scene was maintained through the presence of law enforcement personnel from the Mequon Police Department from the time of officer's initial arrival on scene, until approximately 1:34AM on 5/18/2023, after the conclusion of the scene examination.

At the conclusion of the scene examination, City of Mequon Police Officer Brandy Campbell provided SA Shannon Jones with the completed scene entry log. The scene entry log was electronically attached to this report.

LEGAL AUTHORITY FOR CONDUCTING SCENE EXAMINATION

The Scene examination of the property located at 3119 W. Bonniwell Road was conducted under the legal authority of a search warrant, in which City of Mequon Detective Sean Kilpatrick was the affiant.

On 5/17/2023, Detective Kilpatrick presented the Affidavit and Search Warrant to the Honorable Judge Paul V. Malloy of the Ozaukee County Circuit Court. At approximately 7:46PM, Judge Malloy issued the warrant authorizing the search of the property at 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd., City of Mequon, County of Ozaukee, State of Wisconsin to include the residence, and "any outbuildings or vehicles on the premises."

SCENE DESCRIPTION

The scene was located at 3119 W. Bonniwell Road, City of Mequon, County of Ozaukee, State of Wisconsin. The front of the residence faces north, with the residential lot being located on the south side of Bonniwell Rd. The property is 2.5 acres with two outbuildings located on the south side of the property. The lot was bordered to the south by farm fields, to the east and west by residential properties and to the north by Bonniwell Road (see Figure 1).

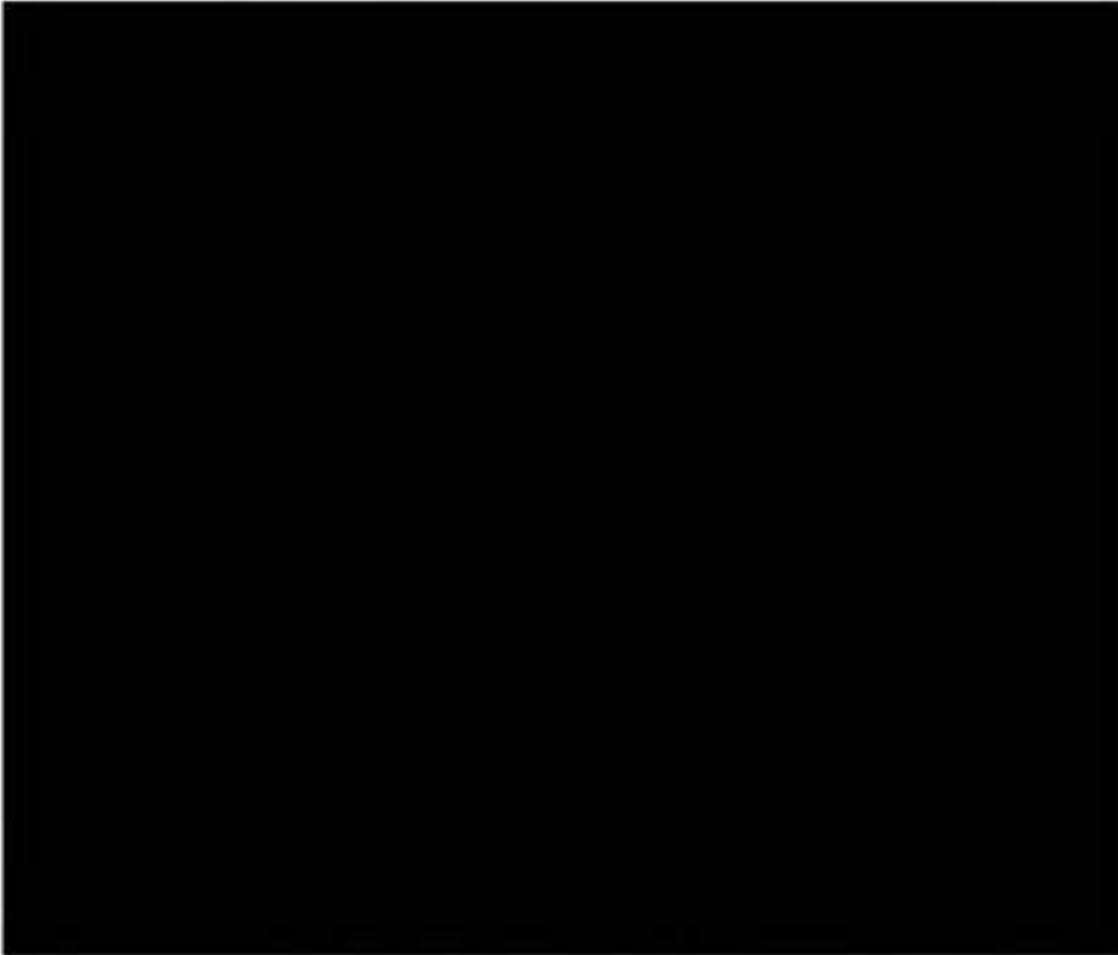

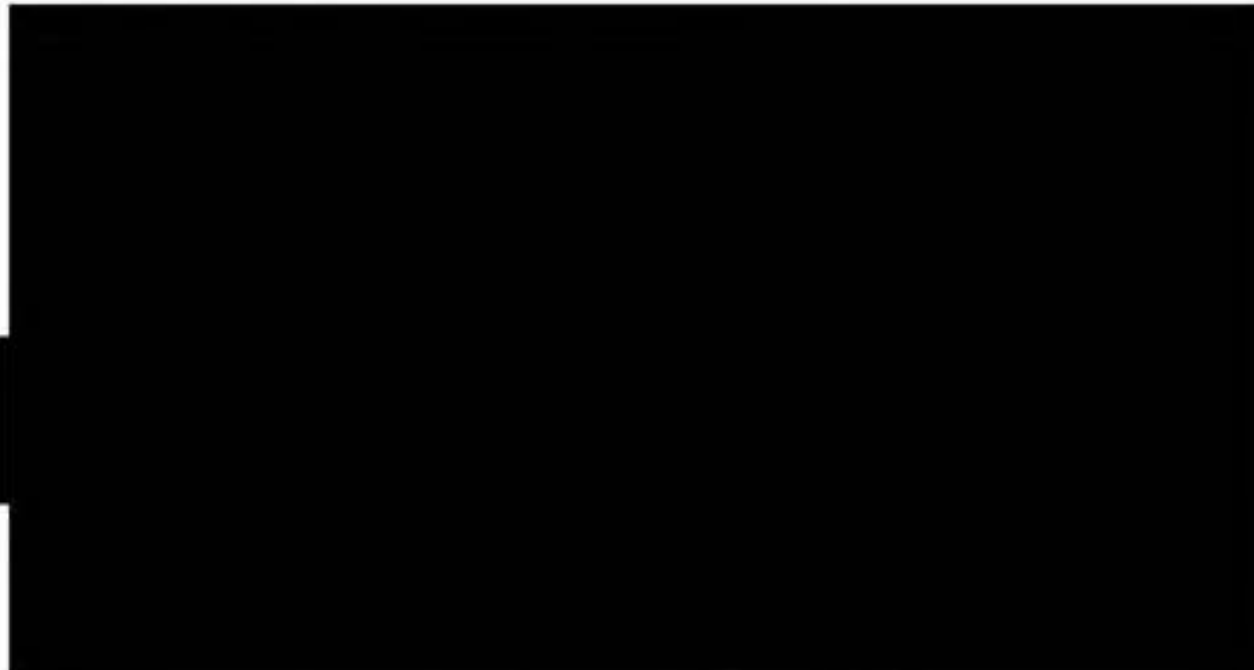
SCENE EXAMINATION

On 5/17/2023, SA Shaw assisted the WSCL-CRSU with the documentation and processing of the scene. The scene documentation and processing occurred from 12/17/2023 at approximately 8:23PM until 5/18/2023 at approximately 1:34AM. On 5/17/2023, at approximately 11:42PM, SA Shaw arrived on scene. Prior to SA Shaw's arrival, the WSCL-CRSU, along with WSP-TRU, in the presence of SA Jones had begun the documentation and processing of the scene. SA Shaw completed a walk through of the residence with SA Jones and observed where items of evidence were located. The below evidence list documents where items were located within the residence and are also documented on the Wisconsin Department of Justice Division of Law Enforcement Services State Crime Laboratory Bureau Receipt of Physical Evidence form DJ-LE-102, which is electronically attached to this report.

The residence, yard and outbuildings were searched for any items of evidentiary value. After the search was completed, the scene examination was focused on the three season room, located on south west corner of the residence and the back yard, located south of the residence. At approximately 11:47PM, the decedent, Pietro Lalicata was removed by the Ozaukee County Medical Examiner's Office personnel, Luke Warnke. SA Scott Marlock documented the removal and transport of the decedent to the Walworth County Medical Examiner's Office, located at 1770 County Rd. NN, Elkhorn, WI 53121. On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at approximately 8:39PM, Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation Special Agents (SAs) Christina McNichol and Todd Higgins met Mequon Police Officer (PO) Matthew Bottoni at the Mequon Police Department, 11300 N. Buntrock Ave., Mequon. The purpose of this contact was to interview PO Bottoni about his response to an incident which occurred earlier in the day at 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd., Mequon.

PO Bottoni stated he is assigned to Mequon Police Squad 25 as a canine officer on the [REDACTED] shift, [REDACTED], and was working in [REDACTED] on May 17, 2023. PO Bottoni continued to state he has worked at Mequon Police Department (PD) for over 3 years but has worked as a law enforcement officer for approximately 11 years total. PO Bottoni explained he entered the City of Mequon on his way to work at the police station at approximately 3:20PM and heard radio activity related to an ongoing incident involving the discharging of a firearm at a person within the City of Mequon. PO Bottoni continued to state that he drove to the Mequon Police Department to obtain fully charged batteries for his police radio and body worn camera and then proceeded directly to the incident staging area at Crossroads Church, 6031 W. Chapel Hill Rd., Mequon. However, as he was arriving, a large contingency of law enforcement personnel was moving to the intersection of Riverland Rd. and W. Bonniwell Rd., Mequon, so PO Bottoni stated he drove to that location as well.

PO Bottoni said that, once he arrived, he met with other officers, including Police Officer Stephanie Vasos, whom he understood to be the officer in charge. PO Bottoni explained that he received a verbal briefing about the ongoing event, which he knew involved a subject firing gunshots towards another person. PO Bottoni stated he equipped himself with a tactical vest and patrol rifle. At that point, PO Bottoni and Mequon Police Officer Boinski were assigned to “get eyes on” the front, or northern side, of the home at 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd.

To better assist agents in understanding his and PO Boinski’s path of travel from Riverland Rd. to the front of the residence, SA McNichol provided PO Bottoni with a printed satellite-view map of the immediate area and asked PO Bottoni to mark their route, beginning from when they left the vehicle staging area on Riverland Rd. PO Bottoni described having a difficult time finding cover that would offer he and his partner protection should they be fired upon. For this reason, their route zigzagged around a little bit. PO Bottoni drew circles on the map in areas where he and PO Boinski paused or stopped their movement and heard gunshots.

PO Bottoni told SAs McNichol and Higgins that he and PO Boinski travelled eastbound from Riverland Rd. via a grass path a resident had cut into the property, then southbound past the home on that property, then eastbound again. PO Bottoni drew a circle near where W. Bonniwell Rd. takes a sharp curve north, just east of the Milwaukee River, to indicate he and his partner stopped there. At that point, PO Bottoni heard 3 gunshots and described the gunshots as being fired at a regular cadence, one after the other. PO Bottoni recalled then hearing a radio transmission indicating officers had just been fired upon. PO Bottoni explained that he was a firearms instructor and had heard lots of gunfire throughout the course of his career, and he knew

the noises he heard were gunfire. PO Bottoni said that he and PO Boinski then moved to the location of where he'd drawn the second circle on the map, just across the street from their previous location, in an attempt to locate cover from gunshot behind trees. When he stopped the second time, PO Bottoni heard two additional gunshots. PO Bottoni estimated these two shots were fired approximately 30 seconds after he heard the first three shots, and explained these two gunshots were also fired one immediately after the other. PO Bottoni related to agents that he then heard Mequon PO Van Laanen broadcast over the radio that the subject was down, but officers could no longer see him or what he was doing. PO Bottoni explained it was at that time he and PO Boinski travelled back westbound and ultimately set themselves up behind the garage of the house they'd passed by earlier, such that they could see the front of the subject's house, including the front door and the subject's truck, which was parked in the driveway on the north side of the home. PO Bottoni stated they held this position until Special Response Team (SRT) personnel arrived, which he felt happened rather quickly. PO Bottoni described seeing the arrival of a bearcat, white SUV, and Ozaukee County Sheriff's squad, and recalled seeing Mequon PO Koltz with perhaps 3 other people from SRT. Around that time, PO Bottoni and his partner parked their squads in front of the home, front end to front end, and continued to monitor the front of the home. PO Bottoni stated he could not see anything happening in the rear (on the south side) of the house. POs Boinski and Bottoni stayed in that position until they were told over the radio that SRT would be taking over scene security and they should return to the Mequon Police Department.

When he completed marking the route on the map, SA McNichol asked PO Bottoni to write his name at the top of the page, which he did. For orientation purposes, it should be noted that the top of the page was North, the right side (Milwaukee River area) was East, the bottom was South, and the left side was West. SA McNichol subsequently scanned this map and attached it to this report for reference.

Before concluding the interview, SA Higgins asked PO Bottoni if he was wearing a body worn camera during this incident. PO Bottoni responded that he had his camera on his person but did not activate it, and explained this was because he was anticipating the incident could last for quite some time, so PO Boinski had his activated and PO Bottoni planned to activate his if and when PO Boinski's camera battery began to run low. PO Bottoni then explained his body worn camera had already been collected by Mequon PD supervisory personnel prior to his meeting with agents.

This interview with PO Bottoni was subsequently concluded.

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice - Division of Criminal Investigation (WIDCJ-DCI) Special Agent (SA) Scott Marlock was instructed to respond to the Mequon Police Department regarding an Officer Involved Death investigation. Once at the Mequon Police Department, SA Marlock was directed by Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Tammy Taubel to respond to the scene, located at 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd, Mequon, WI to conduct a neighborhood canvas.

During the neighborhood canvas, SA Marlock and SA Neil McGrath proceeded to the residence located at [REDACTED] W Bonniwell Rd, Mequon, WI, which is located across the street from the scene location of 3119 W Bonniwell Rd, Mequon, WI. At approximately 9:59pm, SA Marlock and SA McGrath came into contact with the resident of [REDACTED] W Bonniwell Rd and identified her as [REDACTED], date-of-birth [REDACTED]. SA Marlock explained to [REDACTED] they were investigating an incident which occurred earlier in the evening at the residence across the street from her and asked if they would be able to speak with her regarding [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] invited SA Marlock and SA McGrath into her residence and led them to the kitchen table area where she stated they could talk.

[REDACTED] advised agents she was home alone as her husband was at a location in Waukesha for [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] provided a cellular phone number of 414-[REDACTED] and advised agents she and her husband have lived at [REDACTED] W Bonniwell Rd for approximately 25 years.

[REDACTED] stated that on today's date, she had left her residence around 3:00pm to visit her husband at the [REDACTED]. Shortly after leaving, she received a text message from her neighbor [REDACTED] (agents identified her earlier as [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] W Bonniwell Rd, Mequon, WI) that Peter (identified as Pietro La Licata of 3119 W Bonniwell Rd, Mequon, WI and hereinafter referred to as 'Peter') had just shot at her husband [REDACTED] (agents identified him earlier as [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] W Bonniwell Rd, Mequon, WI. [REDACTED] looked at her phone and stated the text from [REDACTED] came in at approximately 3:16pm. [REDACTED] advised agents that she did not hear any gunshots prior to leaving her residence but she is used to Peter shooting. [REDACTED] stated tonight she arrived back home around 8:30pm.

[REDACTED] advised agents that Peter La Licata was already living at 3119 W Bonniwell Rd with his wife [REDACTED] and their children when she and her husband moved in 25 years ago. Shortly after she and her husband moved into the house, which was sometime between April to July, she found a dead goose in front of the house. Peter had walked up to the house and advised them that his son [REDACTED] was hunting, just shot the goose and came to get it. [REDACTED] stated Peter would shoot outside on a regular basis. Peter would go weeks to months without shooting outside then would shoot 2 to 3 nights in a row. [REDACTED] believed the neighbors [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were afraid to call Peter or the police.

[REDACTED] stated she and her husband used to interact with Peter up until ten years ago. They stopped the interaction due to his hunting dog coming over and killing their chickens. When that

was occurring, she and her husband went over and told Peter he had to keep his dogs in his own yard. Shortly after that interaction, Peter came over with a bottle of wine and told the [REDACTED] that the next time his dog came over to hit her. Peter further stated if the [REDACTED] dogs had come over to his property he would kill them. [REDACTED] stated Peter's dog - Tina, was gone shortly after that. Peter advised them that Tina ate rat poison.

[REDACTED] stated that over last five years, Peter's paranoia has gotten much worse and he has become increasingly grumpy. The last few months she has been calling the police due to the gunshots. [REDACTED] was advised by the officers that she and the neighbors needed to call the police when they heard the gunshots. In mid to late March of this year, [REDACTED] told the police and adult protective services that it was dangerous and an escalating situation with Peter. [REDACTED] was advised by adult services over the phone that they would send someone out, never heard back from them.

[REDACTED] was aware that Peter's daughter had lived with him at 3119 W Bonniwell for a while in early to mid March. One day, the daughter was gone but had told [REDACTED] she was [REDACTED] so was moving out.

[REDACTED] did not have any further information to provide to agents at that time. SA Marlock provided [REDACTED] with a business card listing his name and contact information. SA Marlock advised [REDACTED] to reach out to SA Marlock should she have any further information, concerns or questions.

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at approximately 8:38 p.m., DCI Special Agents Neil McGrath and Scott Marlock contacted [REDACTED] DOB: [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] DOB: [REDACTED] at their residence located at [REDACTED] W. Bonniwell Rd., Mequon, WI. The Special Agents identified themselves, displaying their badges and credentials. S/A McGrath told them that DCI was investigating the officer involved shooting incident that had previously occurred at the residence of their neighbor, located at 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd. The Special Agents had received information that [REDACTED] had contacted police after being shot at by their neighbor, known to investigators to be Pietro La Licata, and that the [REDACTED] previously gave a statement about the incident to a Mequon Police Officer. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] agreed to speak with the Special Agents and provided the following information:

Earlier that day, at approximately 3:13 p.m. [REDACTED] had been cutting grass in his back yard, using his riding mower. [REDACTED] stated he was wearing sunglasses, a hooded sweatshirt and had ear buds in. When he approached the east end of his property, he observed Pietro La Licata, his neighbor (whom he refers to as Peter or Mr. La Licata), standing outside the door of La Licata's sun room area holding a long gun. As [REDACTED] went past, he heard a gunshot. [REDACTED] turned his head to see La Licata pointing the gun at him. [REDACTED] raised his hand and cried out for La Licata not to shoot, continuing to drive away from him on the lawn mower, toward the west side of the house. [REDACTED] believed La Licata was holding a shotgun. [REDACTED] believed La Licata was going to shoot him and was fearful for his life.

Once [REDACTED] got to the west side of his house, he got off of the tractor mower and hurried inside of his residence. He told his wife, [REDACTED] and son, [REDACTED], to go into the basement and [REDACTED] called 911. [REDACTED] also retrieved his own handgun from inside the residence and carried it with him as he and his family took shelter in the basement. [REDACTED] stayed on the phone with 911 until they told him to hang up and police would be calling him. A short time later police did contact him by phone and told him to remain in the residence while they were working on a strategy to deal with the situation. Police did not call him back. The [REDACTED] waited in the basement and noticed a police presence down the road to the [REDACTED].

At approximately 4:15 p.m., they were not sure what to do and decided to send their son [REDACTED] away from the house to his [REDACTED] game. [REDACTED] drove down the road past police and called his parents to tell them there was a large group of police down the road to the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] noticed some officers run through the back yard area and position themselves back there. He noticed an officer with a shield and another appearing to be a [REDACTED] wearing a ghillie suit.

At approximately five p.m. they heard multiple shots fired. [REDACTED] believed the first shot sounded like a shotgun and there were other shots after that that sounded like from a different type of gun. They moved away from the windows to the middle of the basement. [REDACTED] could see officers approach La Licata's house and the window on La Licata's sun porch to be broken.

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Friends and neighbors were contacting the [REDACTED] by phone and text, asking them about the situation. They heard rumors that La Licata was on the run from police. The [REDACTED] decided to leave the residence and drove down the road where they were told by police not to leave and to return to their residence where an officer would meet them. The Bowers returned to their residence and were met by a female police officer who took their statement regarding the shooting incident that occurred while [REDACTED] was cutting the grass.

The [REDACTED] asked if La Licata had been killed and S/A McGrath told them he had been. [REDACTED] stated that La Licata's daughter had contacted them and told them he had died. Both [REDACTED] appeared upset over the incident.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated that they moved into their current residence approximately ten years ago. It was at time they met their neighbor whom they referred to as "Peter" or Mr. La Licata. They described La Licata as speaking with an Italian accent. Initially, when they moved in, their relationship with La Licata was mostly friendly. As the years went by, however, La Licata began to complain about several things. Some of the things he complained about were:

- Requesting the [REDACTED] to move their mound system because he believed it was leeching into his water system;
- Threatening to sue the [REDACTED];
- Acting increasingly paranoid, accusing [REDACTED] of spying on him with an electrical pole, a birdhouse camera, and from a secret camera in his garage;
- Accusing [REDACTED] of poisoning La Licata's dogs;
- Accusing [REDACTED] of having a razor blade collar for his dog;
- Accusing [REDACTED] of trying to flood his house;

La Licata would complain in an aggressive manner, however most times could be talked down from his angry state. Lately, however, this was not the case. On one occasion, La Licata drove his lawn mower up [REDACTED] driveway and argued with [REDACTED] about the [REDACTED] floodlights being pointed at his house, which [REDACTED] denied. La Licata attempted to punch [REDACTED], who avoided him and told La Licata to "knock it off". La Licata then stopped trying to attack him.

There was also a dispute of La Licata directing his water to drain on the [REDACTED] property. [REDACTED] complained to the town permits department approximately two years ago. Someone was sent out to inspect the situation and told him that what La Licata had done was not right and he was not supposed to do that, however there was nothing they or the [REDACTED] could do about it.

[REDACTED] stated he always stayed off of La Licata's property and only recalled a few occasions when he went over there, each time approaching from the front down the driveway due to safety

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concerns. La Licata had several cameras up on his property. They learned from his daughter [REDACTED] that La Licata often sat inside of his residence and monitored the cameras.

La Licata's behavior became increasingly more paranoid and unreasonable. They learned from La Licata's son [REDACTED] that he was afraid his father would shoot him and avoided coming by to visit him. La Licata's daughter, [REDACTED], had lived with La Licata in the fall of 2022 for a couple of months, however became afraid of her father after he choked her.

On the evening of April 14 or 15, [REDACTED] recalled sitting out on their back deck with their son [REDACTED] when they heard two shots coming from the direction of La Licata's residence. They went inside of the residence in fear that La Licata was possibly shooting in their direction. They did not call police for that incident. Both of the [REDACTED] stated that La Licata frequently shot guns on his property, oftentimes at night. [REDACTED] had often observed La Licata carrying firearms while on his (La Licata's own) property, however La Licata had never pointed a firearm at [REDACTED] or anyone in their family until this evening.

On April 16, police came to the [REDACTED] residence. Apparently La Licata had called police to complain about [REDACTED]. Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] spoke with the police and told them about La Licata shooting guns at night.

[REDACTED] stated that their neighbor, [REDACTED], who lives across the street, also frequently heard the shots and had discussed this with her. [REDACTED] stated that on April 17, 2023, she and their neighbor [REDACTED] both contacted Ozaukee County Human Services to request an evaluation of La Licata out of concern of his well being and that he may be a threat to himself or to others. They did not hear anything back from Ozaukee County Human Services regarding the incident.

[REDACTED] provided his cellphone number (414) [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] provided hers (414) [REDACTED]. Both agreed they could be contacted should the agents have any further questions. S/A McGrath provided the [REDACTED] with his business card and contact information should they have any questions. The Special Agents thanked the [REDACTED] for their cooperation.

Prior to leaving the residence, [REDACTED] showed S/A McGrath and S/A Marlock his riding mower and the route he was cutting grass in the back yard when La Licata had shot and pointed the gun at him. [REDACTED] stated that La Licata was holding the gun in a way where [REDACTED] could see the end of the barrel aimed at him. Agents McGrath and Marlock could observe clearly La Licata's sunporch from the spot in the yard [REDACTED] pointed out.

The interview was concluded at approximately 9:40 p.m.



Due to the disturbance and threatening phone calls to myself and family I am seeking a restraining order to be placed on [REDACTED]. The restraining order shall cease all phone calls to my home, and any personal contact with myself and any member of my family. I am concerned that he is unstable because of the threats he has made to my husband and the emotional strain he is putting on my son [REDACTED].

Two years ago I picked up my son [REDACTED] at Hardee's parking lot in Saukville, Wisconsin where his father, [REDACTED] verbally attacked me. While entering the on ramp to the expressway he stopped his car forcing me to stop and came to the window of my car and started shouting at me. He continued to follow me down the expressway shouting out the window. This scene scared me and also upset my son.

During the past year he has been emotionally draining on my son [REDACTED] by insisting that [REDACTED] make a decision to live with him or me. Based on this decision he will proceed with filing papers to change custody. This emotional strain has been very hard on [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] has had stomach problems which has lead to vomiting because of this emotional upset.

Early this spring [REDACTED] verbally attacked my brother at a gas station. He saw my brother pull into a gas station and followed him where he proceeded to shout in my brother's face.. He was completely out of control!

On June 16th my husband and I took [REDACTED] to meet his Dad in Shawano Wisconsin. He was to meet us there by 10:30 a.m., instead he came an hour late. When my husband mentioned to him he was lucky we were about to leave, [REDACTED] blew up and verbally attacked him and wanted to pick a fight with my husband. Once we were in the car he came back to my husband's side of the car and called my husband all kinds of names. That evening after we came home from transporting [REDACTED], [REDACTED] called our home approximately 5:00 p.m. to harass us again. On June 18th at approximately 6:45 a.m. he called and when my husband answered he threatened to do bodily harm to my husband. I did write a letter to [REDACTED] on July 8, 1996 and told him that I would not allow him to call our home again because of his irrational behavior. I would have the children call his home collect. Although he did not pickup the certified letter I know he was aware of the content since I did send his mother, [REDACTED] a copy.

Three weeks before [REDACTED] came home his father made [REDACTED] call a number of times to tell me that he wanted to live with his Dad. I told [REDACTED] that if his Dad wanted him to live there he needed to change our divorce agreement and the decision would not be his but would be made in court. His Dad sent the papers to me to modify physical placement of [REDACTED] and child support for our

daughter in hopes that I would sign the papers.

His Dad called three times since [redacted] has been home and has told [redacted] that he would give him until Friday (August 30) to make up his mind. When I found this out I again told [redacted] that this wasn't his decision to make and that I would tell his Dad the next time he called that he could no longer call our home and I would allow [redacted] to call him collect once a week. On August 28th his Dad called and I informed him that [redacted] would call him collect once a week and he went crazy over the phone. He continued to call our home that evening repeatedly for over an hour. He called my step son [redacted] names when he answered the phone, he called again and told [redacted] that he was quitting his job and hung up. As the evening went on his calls became more bizarre. He called the next morning 8/29 several times and he left a message on my voice mail at work stating that if he couldn't talk to [redacted] he would take me to court and I wouldn't get a dime. He called 8/30 6:00 a.m. and told my husband that "he would be the first", he called 6:15 8/30 and told my husband again--"don't forget you will be the first", he called 7:45 a.m. 8/30 and told my husband he would see him at the family reunion (I don't know what he was referring to since there was no family reunion). He called 8/31 7:00 a.m. and when my husband answered he shouted "Good Morning", 8/31 8:30 a.m. he called again and when my husband answered he said "Daylight in the swamp", at 9:30 8/31 I received a call from a woman saying it was an emergency call for [redacted] from his father [redacted]. On 8/31 7:30 p.m. he called our home and told my husband that he just quit his job, he called again at 7:45 p.m. 8/31 and said he was going to cut my husband's tongue off. On 9/1 he called several times and told my husband that he was coming to our home to get him.

On Sunday 9/1 I did allow [redacted] to call his father. [redacted] ended up crying on the phone. When I asked him what it was all about he said his Dad wanted an answer and if he didn't live with him he would quit his job and his mother wouldn't get a dime for child support.

[redacted] is totally out of control. He has harassed me, my family, and he is emotionally upsetting [redacted]. His actions cause me to fear for my family's safety, and not to mention the mental strain he puts on [redacted].

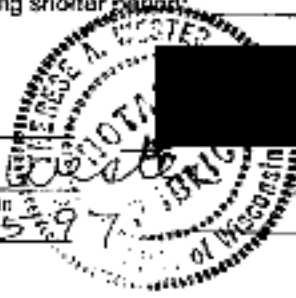



Guttman and I entered the residence and observed that many of the pictures on the walls had been tilted and that drawers in the living room, kitchen, dining room were open. P.O. Guttman and I cleared the residence to ensure there was no suspect in the house. Before entering the building I could observe a rubber surgical glove which was lying on the driveway. (See P.O. GUTTMANN's supplemental report).

The residence is described as a single story 3 bedroom with a full finished basement in a secluded area.

I conducted a walk through visual inspection of the residence with [REDACTED] LALICATA and observed the bedrooms were in a further state of disarray than the rest of the residence. 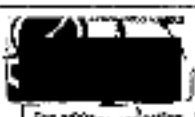

At approximately 9:30am I contact the Amoco Security Division and spoke with Linda (employee #623) who informed me that the LALICATA Amoco card #2 was used at Two J's gas station in Richfield on 11/17/98, at 8:53pm for \$11.00 purchase and again on 11/19/98, 5:56pm, for a purchase of \$20.95. Linda informed me that this appears to be the last use of this card and does not show any other postings. She further stated that it is their policy to now freeze the card despite our desire to maintain an open account. At this time the card is in fact frozen. She does not show any transactions on this card at any other location after 11/19/98.

I contacted Two J's Amoco in Richfield, Wisconsin, phone #628-9500 and spoke with manager named Penny. Penny informed me that they do have in store security video that only covers the interior of the store and not the outside pumps. She reports that the videos are turned over within a couple of days and does not believe that she has any of the dates the card was used at Two J's. I did provide her with the dates in question and she will double check to determine whether or not she has any video.

The LALICATA's Amoco card was also used at Stop N'Go store located in Hartford, Wisconsin. I contacted store manager Debbie at [REDACTED] and was informed that they do have in store security video and outdoor video that covers two out of the six gas pumps. She will check her video inventory to see if in fact she does have the tape for 11/06 & 09/98, those being the dates the credit card was used at that location.

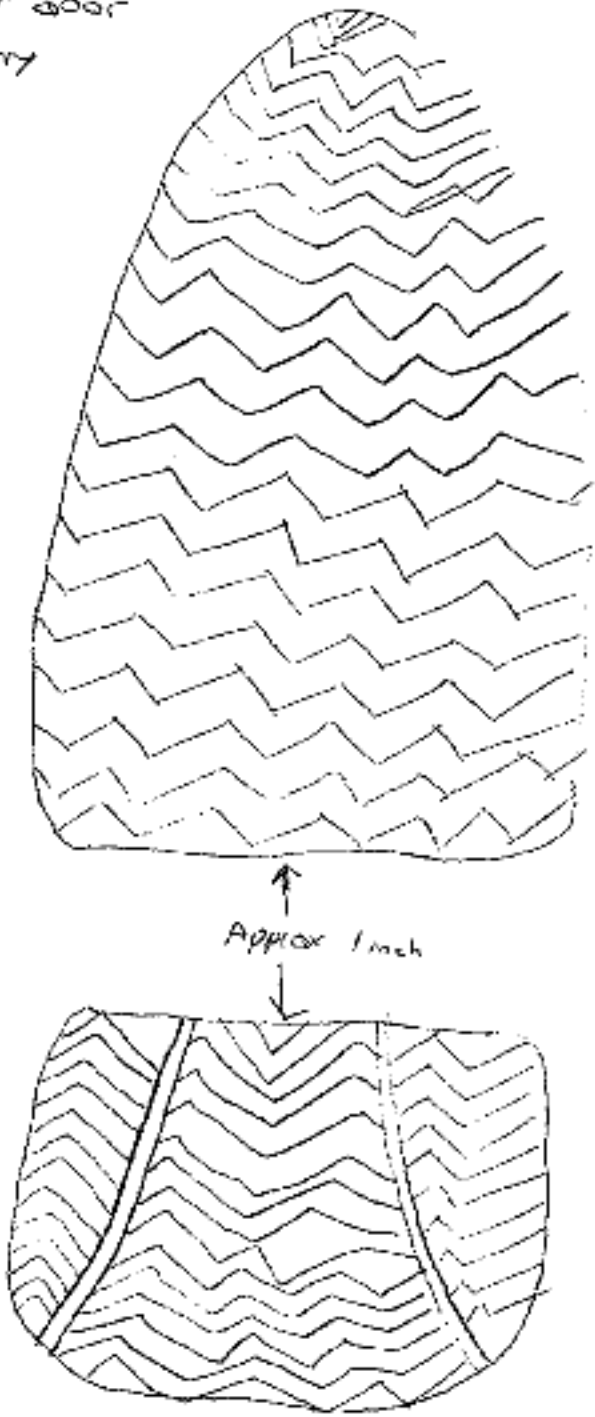

On 05/17/2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice – Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ-DCI) Special Agent (S/A) Courtney R. Bauer conducted an interview of a law enforcement officer that was present for an officer-involved critical incident that occurred on 05/17/2023 at 3119 West Bonniwell Road, City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin.

S/A Bauer was assigned to interview Mequon Police Department (MUPD) Police Officer Stephanie A. Vasos. The interview was conducted at the Mequon Police Department in an interview room.

INTERVIEW OF OFFICER STEPHANIE A. VASOS

On 05/17/2023, at approximately 8:51 p.m., S/A Bauer and WI DOJ-DCI S/A Nicholas L. Gates met with Officer Vasos in a common area of the police department and walked to an interview room. S/A Bauer and S/A Gates introduced themselves to Officer Vasos and Officer Vasos agreed to speak with S/A Bauer and S/A Gates.

Officer Vasos stated she had been a member of the MUPD since September 2012, approximately ten and one-half years. She stated she was currently serving as a police officer; however, she had served as a rotational detective from September 2019 to September 2022. Officer Vasos stated she had been assigned as the acting supervisor on shift that day (05/17/2023), as both shift sergeants were not on duty. Officer Vasos stated her normal hours were [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] and she was assigned to [REDACTED] hours on 05/17/2023. She stated she had slept well and “fairly normal” the night prior, woke up around 7:00 a.m., and arrived at the MUPD for shift at approximately 7:35 a.m.

S/A Bauer asked Officer Vasos about her shift prior to the officer-involved critical incident, and she stated the shift had not been out of the ordinary. Officer Vasos explained she was supposed to be leaving for vacation the next day (05/18/2023), so she had been “trying to get things done.” She stated her day consisted of reviewing reports and she had responded to one call for service prior to the officer-involved critical incident.

S/A Bauer asked Officer Vasos how she was alerted to the initial incident on Bonniwell Road. Officer Vasos stated at approximately 3:15 p.m., dispatch advised over the radio that the reporting party had been shot at by their neighbor. Officer Vasos stated she responded to the staging area at Crossroads Church, which had been established by the patrol officer working that area, Police Officer Austin D. Boinski. Officer Vasos stated she was familiar with the area of the call for service due to prior hunting calls, but she did not recall ever having contact with the subjects involved in the call. Officer Vasos stated once she was at the staging area, MUPD Detective (Det.) Lance Wegner “took charge” due to his prior knowledge of the suspect (Pietro La Licata) and his family. It should be noted that Officer Vasos did not utilize La Licata’s name during her interview, but for purposes of clarity in this report, the suspect’s name will be used.

Officer Vasos stated Det. Wegner attempted to make phone contact with La Licata's son, as law enforcement did not want to contact La Licata directly prior to being on scene. While at staging, Officer Vasos also learned that MUPD Officer Brian Gensrick had been to the La Licata residence recently with the Department of Aging. Officer Vasos stated the Department of Aging had received information that La Licata was elderly and suffering from dementia.

Once Det. Wegner made phone contact with one of La Licata's sons, he learned La Licata's other son had not had contact with La Licata in approximately six years. Det. Wegner informed personnel La Licata had approximately twenty firearms in his residence, but his son believed he would be "law enforcement friendly." Officer Vasos also stated during the response, law enforcement observed a "thin blue line" sticker on La Licata's truck.

Officer Vasos stated she had provided Det. Wegner with internal phone numbers for La Licata and La Licata's son also provided Det. Wegner with a phone number for him. Officer Vasos stated once law enforcement was in the area of La Licata's residence, Det. Wegner attempted to contact La Licata but all of his attempts went "straight to voicemail," as did La Licata's son's attempts to contact his father.

Officer Vasos recalled staging closer to the scene, at the intersection of West Bonniwell Road and Riverland Road, which she pointed out on a printed map. She stated she assigned MUPD Police Officer William Van Laanen and MUPD Police Officer Steven Beattie to establish a perimeter south of La Licata's residence. She stated once the officers were on the south side of the residence, Officer Van Laanen took a position by a large tree to observe the southwest corner of the residence and Officer Beattie took a position by a shed to observe the southeast corner of the residence. Officer Vasos stated shortly after those officers took their positions, Officer Gensrick joined Officer Van Laanen by the tree. Officer Vasos stated she assigned Officer Boinski and MUPD Police Officer Matthew Bottoni to establish a perimeter on the north side of the residence.

Officer Vasos stated she was standing near the intersection of West Bonniwell Road and Riverland Road with Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office (OZSO) Sergeant (Sgt.) Becky Swanson, whom S/A Bauer later determined to be Sgt. Becky Ronan, OZSO Deputy Michael Ganey, and OZSO Deputy Wade Navis when she heard Officer Van Laanen state the suspect had a gun. Officer Vasos stated she started running toward the residence with Sgt. Ronan, Deputy Ganey, and Deputy Navis, one of which was carrying a ballistic shield. Officer Vasos stated Officer Van Laanen requesting "clearance for the shot" and she stated she told him he had clearance as long as the suspect knew he was law enforcement and their presence had been announced. Officer Vasos recalled that as Officer Van Laanen was requesting clearance, simultaneously she heard "one gunshot, a pause, and then two more." Officer Vasos stated two of the gunshots sounded the same, but the last one was "distinct and loud."

Officer Vasos stated she staged south of the residence with Sgt. Ronan, Deputy Ganey, and Deputy Navis until the Ozaukee County Special Response Team (SRT) arrived on scene. She stated she did not enter the La Licata residence at any time during the response.

After Officer Vasos relayed the above information, she stated she believed there had been a dog in the La Licata residence, as someone had broadcast over the radio that La Licata had let his dog outside while law enforcement was on scene. She also stated she believed the suspect had been in the sunroom and never came out. She stated when she was south of the residence, she could see an open window to the sunroom and “pellets” in the tree by Officer Van Laanen and Officer Gensrick.

S/A Gates asked Officer Vasos if she had been given a description of the suspect and she stated when Officer Van Laanen made his way to his perimeter position south of the residence, he had broadcast a description of the suspect, which Officer Vasos recalled as a “white male with gray hair and a blue shirt.” She stated Officer Van Laanen also stated the suspect was initially “drinking something” and did not have a weapon. She stated Officer Van Laanen also reported he did not observe anyone in the residence with the suspect and at one point was able to give a description of the suspect’s tan pants.

Officer Vasos also recalled Sgt. Ronan telling her that after the incident while she was still south of the residence, she could see a long-gun strap hanging out of the sunroom window.

The interview concluded at approximately 9:25 p.m.

INTERVIEW OF DETECTIVE SEAN M. KILPATRICK

On 05/17/2023, at approximately 10:06 p.m., S/A Bauer and WI DOJ-DCI S/A Nicholas L. Gates met with Det. Kilpatrick in an interview room at the MUPD. S/A Bauer and S/A Gates introduced themselves to Det. Kilpatrick and Det. Kilpatrick agreed to speak with S/A Bauer and S/A Gates.

Det. Kilpatrick stated he had worked for the MUPD since 2015, approximately eight years. He stated he was currently serving as a detective, a role that he had been assigned in January 2023. Prior to working for the MUPD, Det. Kilpatrick had worked for six months as a community service officer for the West Bend Police Department (WBPD).

Det. Kilpatrick stated his normal hours were [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] and he was assigned to [REDACTED] hours on 05/17/2023. He stated he had slept “fine” (normal) the night prior, woke up around 7:00 a.m., and arrived at the MUPD for shift at approximately 9:45 a.m. Det. Kilpatrick stated after waking up and prior to shift he spent time with his [REDACTED], went on a walk, and stopped at the dry cleaners.

S/A Bauer asked Det. Kilpatrick about his shift prior to the officer-involved critical incident, and he stated the shift had consisted of paperwork and that he had been at his desk almost all day. Det. Kilpatrick stated he was alerted to the initial incident on West Bonniwell Road by dispatch who stated someone had shot at their neighbor. Det. Kilpatrick stated he responded to Crossroads Church with Det. Lance Wegner at the direction of the patrol officers. He stated once they arrived at the church, patrol began working on a plan while Det. Wegner attempted to contact the suspect’s children. Det. Kilpatrick stated the patrol officers determined their plan of action was to approach the suspect’s home and establish a perimeter. He stated once the officers had established the perimeter, Det. Wegner would call the suspect.

Det. Kilpatrick stated the officers proceeded to the area of the initial incident on West Bonniwell Road and his squad was positioned near the intersection of West Bonniwell Road and Riverland Road. Det. Kilpatrick stated MUPD Police Officer Steven Beattie and MUPD Police Officer William Van Laanen proceeded to the rear of the house and once they were there and perimeter was established, Det. Wegner attempted phone contact with the suspect (Pietro La Licata). Det. Wegner’s attempts to contact La Licata all went straight to voicemail. Det. Wegner also

attempted to mobilize the Ozaukee County Special Response Team (SRT) while Det. Kilpatrick remained in the squad and drafted arrest and search warrants.

Det. Kilpatrick stated there was a group of law enforcement officers standing outside near his squad while he was working on the warrants and at some point, he exited his squad and joined them. Det. Kilpatrick stated while he was outside his squad talking to the officers, he heard one gunshot, a pause, and then two to three gunshots. Det. Kilpatrick described three of the gunshots sounding "the same" and stated there was "at least one" gunshot that sounded different, which he described to be in the second grouping of shots.

Det. Kilpatrick recalled once the shots were heard "everyone" ran towards the shots, including him. He stated he started in that direction then pivoted and returned to the squad to retrieve a medical bag, as he was a trained paramedic, then ran towards the scene. He described his route as running south through yards and then east along a fence line.

Det. Kilpatrick stated he staged in the brush south of the residence with other officers and discussed "pushing up" to the west side of La Licata's residence with a shield but was told by the responding SRT to wait. Det. Kilpatrick stated they waited and once SRT arrived on scene, SRT "pressed up" the east side of the tree line to the west side of the La Licata residence. Det. Kilpatrick stated the team did not "press up" until they had received confirmation via drone footage that the suspect was "down." Det. Kilpatrick stated he approached the residence with the SRT and entered the residence through a shattered glass door on the west side of the sunroom, into the sunroom. Det. Kilpatrick stated when he entered the sunroom he observed the suspect lying supine on the floor of the sunroom with his head towards the southeast near the windows. Det. Kilpatrick also recalled observing a long gun on the windowsill, a long gun on the ground near the windows, and a long gun on the north side of the room propped against the wall. He also observed three unfired shotgun shells on the floor near the windowsill.

Det. Kilpatrick stated he assisted the SRT medic with ascertaining a three-lead on the suspect and determined [REDACTED]. He also stated the suspect had a [REDACTED].

UNIFORM AND WEAPONS INSPECTION

On May 17, 2023, at approximately 9:00 pm, SA Ward and SA Lofy conducted a uniform and weapons inspection of Mequon Police Officer Brian Gensrick. Officer Gensrick showed no signs of injury or impairment. SA Ward saw no signs of blood or biological agents on the uniform.

Officer Gensrick was wearing a dark blue patrol uniform which consisted of a short sleeve shirt, trousers, and black boots. The uniform shirt displayed Mequon Police patches on the left shoulder and an American flag on the right shoulder. Officer Gensrick was also wearing an exterior vest carrier which had the name "B Gensrick " in white displayed above the right breast pocket and a stitched Mequon Police badge above the left breast pocket. The word "Police" is also visible below the badge. On Officer Gensrick 's back the word "POLICE" is prominently written in white capital letters across the shoulder blade area of the exterior vest carrier.

Officer Gensrick 's black nylon belt had the following items (wearer's left to right):

- Double magazine carrier containing two Glock 17 magazines.
- Taser holster containing a Taser 7 (yellow in color) with Mequon Police number two.
- Streamlight Flashlight and holder
- Black latex glove pouch.
- Glock Model 17 with optic.
- Double handcuff case carrying two sets of handcuffs.

Across the front of the external vest carrier (wearer's right to wearer's left):

- IFAC case containing medical supplies.
- Motorola handheld police radio with attached hand microphone.
- OC case carrying a can of OC Aerosol spray.
- Expandable baton on the right side.
- Double handcuff case carrying two sets of handcuffs.
- Cradle for body worn camera.

The three Glock 17 magazines were unloaded on the office desk and the ammunition placed in rows. The magazines contained the following unfired cartridges:

Magazine 1 contained 17 9mm Luger jacketed hollow point rounds.

The magazines and ammunition were photographed by SA Lofy.

The Glock 17 Generation 5 handgun (Serial Number: BXFN334) was removed from the holster and rendered safe by SA Ward. A magazine was removed from the magazine well and one unfired cartridge was ejected from the chamber of the weapon. The cartridge in the chamber was a 9mm Luger jacketed hollow point round and displayed no damage or indentation to the head stamp.

The handgun magazine was unloaded and contained 17 Federal 9mm Luger rounds of jacketed hollow point ammunition.

SA Ward then obtained Officer Gensrick's patrol rifle. This rifle was a Colt AR15A3 and had serial number LBD04426699 (also marked SQ #6). SA Ward and SA Lofy conducted an inspection of the rifle and accompanying rifle vest from Gensrick's squad. The rifle was in a "squad ready condition" meaning it had an empty chamber with a magazine containing 28, 5.56/.223 rounds.

The outer vest contained two more rifle magazines each loaded with 28 round and two additional Glock 17 magazines both loaded with 17 9 mm rounds.

UNIFORM AND WEAPONS INSPECTION

On May 17, 2023, at approximately 8:00 pm, SA Ward and SA Lofy conducted a uniform and weapons inspection of Mequon Police Officer Steven Beattie. Officer Beattie showed no signs of injury or impairment. SA Ward saw no signs of blood or biological agents on the uniform.

Officer Beattie was wearing a dark blue patrol uniform which consisted of a long sleeve shirt, trousers, and black boots. The uniform shirt displayed Mequon Police patches on the left shoulder and an American flag on the right shoulder. Officer Beattie was also wearing an exterior vest carrier which had the name "Beattie" displayed above the right breast pocket and a stitched Mequon Police badge above the left breast pocket.

Officer Beattie's black nylon belt had the following items (wearer's left to right):

- Double magazine carrier containing two Glock 17 magazines.
- Taser holster containing a Taser 7 (yellow in color) with Mequon Police number one.
- Motorola handheld police radio with attached hand microphone
- Black latex glove pouch.
- Expandable baton.
- Glock Model 17 with optic.
- OC case and OC
- Double handcuff case carrying two sets of handcuffs.

Across the front of the external vest carrier (wearer's right to wearer's left):

- Harness for body worn camera.
- Handheld microphone for radio.

The three Glock 17 magazines were unloaded on the office desk and the ammunition placed in rows. The magazines contained the following unfired cartridges:

- Magazine 1 contained 17 9mm Luger jacketed hollow point rounds.
- Magazine 2 contained 17 9mm Luger jacketed hollow point rounds.

The magazines and ammunition were photographed by SA Lofy.

The Glock 17 Generation 5 handgun (Serial Number: BXFN336) was removed from the holster and rendered safe by SA Ward. A magazine was removed from the magazine well and one unfired cartridge was ejected from the chamber of the weapon. The cartridge in the chamber was a 9mm Luger jacketed hollow point round and displayed no damage or indentation to the head stamp.

The handgun magazine was unloaded and contained 17 Federal 9mm Luger rounds of jacketed hollow point ammunition.

SA Ward then obtained Officer 's patrol rifle. This rifle was a Colt AR15A3 and had serial number LBD044268. SA Ward and SA Lofy conducted an inspection of the rifle and accompanying rifle vest from Beattie's squad. The rifle was in a "squad ready condition" meaning it had an empty chamber with a magazine containing 28, 5.56/.223 rounds.

The outer vest contained two more rifle magazines each loaded with 28 round and two additional Glock 17 magazines both loaded with 17 9 mm rounds.

Once the inspection was complete, all the equipment was returned to Officer Beattie. The weapons and uniform inspection ended at approximately 9:00 pm.

On Monday, May 22nd, 2023, Wisconsin (WI) Department of Justice (DOJ)-Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) Special Agent (SA) Kadija Walusay and Special Agent (SA) Shannon Jones conducted an interview of an officer that was present for an officer-involved critical incident that occurred on 05/17/2023 at 3119 West Bonniwell Road, City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin.

SA's Walusay and Jones were assigned to interview Mequon Police Officer Brian Gensrick. The interview was scheduled for 05/22/23 to take place at the DCI Milwaukee Field Office (MiFO) located at [REDACTED] in the City of Brookfield, County of Waukesha, WI 53045. The interview took place in the conference/training room of the MiFO at approximately 1145hours. The people in the conference room present for the interview consisted of SA Walusay, SA Jones, Police Officer (hereafter referred to as Officer Gensrick) Brian Gensrick, and Officer Gensrick's legal counsel, Attorney William R. Rettko (Rettko Law Offices located at 15460 W. Capitol Drive #150, Brookfield, WI 53005).

Prior to beginning the interview, SA Jones advised Officer Gensrick that it is common practice to record that interviews. SA Jones further advised Officer Gensrick that his legal counsel had already requested that the interview not be recorded, Officer Gensrick did not verbalize any objections to the denial of the recording device.

INTERVIEW OF POLICE OFFICER BRIAN J. GENSRICK

Officer Gensrick stated he is currently employed by the Mequon Police Department (11300 N. Buntrock Avenue, Mequon, WI 53092) as a [REDACTED] shift patrol officer. Officer Gensrick began his employment with the Mequon Police Department on 07/18/2016 and was assigned badge number 943. Prior to his employment at the Mequon Police Department, he attended the University of Wisconsin Whitewater where he earned his bachelor's degree in Sociology with an emphasis in Criminal Justice, he graduated in December of 2011. In the spring of 2012, Officer Gensrick attended the 520-hour Police Academy at Blackhawk Technical College. Officer Gensrick then began his first sworn law enforcement job as a seasonal employee of the Town of Troy as a Patrol Officer. In December of 2014 he discontinued his employment with the Town of Troy and began working as a Patrol Officer at the City of Beloit Police Department until approximately July 8th, 2016. Shortly before beginning his career at the Mequon Police Department.

During his employment at the Mequon Police Department, Officer Gensrick has been certified and/or participated in the following trainings: Critical Incident Training (CIT), FBI LEEDA, Mequon Police Department In-Service, Wisconsin State Law Enforcement Firearms Qualification (Summer of 2022), on-duty handgun firearms training, Rifle Training (not state qualification), and Field Training and Field Training Officer training course.

Officer Gensrick is currently assigned to [REDACTED] shift patrol and his hours are [REDACTED] hours until [REDACTED] hours. Officer Gensrick is on a rotating schedule working [REDACTED] days on shift with [REDACTED] days

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off. Officer Gensrick stated that on Wednesday 05/17/2023 he was on the [REDACTED] day of his work week. Officer Gensrick stated that it is typical to be assigned a different squad area on day-to-day shifts. Officer Gensrick stated he usually knows what his daily squad area assignment will be approximately a week or two beforehand. Officer Gensrick stated that on 05/17/2023 he was assigned to be the “cover car”, which is essentially a floating squad that assists other squads if they are to be dispatched to a “two officer” call, or if a squad assigned to a particular area is on lunch or tied up in another capacity.

The day before the incident was Tuesday 05/16/2023, and Officer Gensrick stated he worked his [REDACTED] shift hours ([REDACTED] hours until [REDACTED] hours). Officer Gensrick stated he arrived at work at approximately 0710 or 0715 hours and headed to the locker room to change into his uniform (this is his routine every day). He then went to a phone and checked his work voicemail in case he had missed a call while he was in between shifts. He then checked the Mequon Police Department “calls for service” (CFS). Officer Gensrick then equipped himself with all of his duty gear, including his Electronic Control Device (ECD), department issued radio, and body worn camera. Officer Gensrick did not attend the shift roll call that takes place at 0745 hours because he was assigned as the “east side car”. Officer Gensrick stated it is not required to attend roll call when assigned as the east side squad because the administration wants that squad on the road right away with no overlap. Officer Gensrick confirmed that if he were assigned a different area, he would have attended roll call. Officer Gensrick stated that his shift on Tuesday was normal and as he thought back nothing stuck out as out of the “norm”. Officer Gensrick was able to get off of work on time and did not work any overtime on Tuesday. After work, he either went to a family function in the city of Mequon at his [REDACTED], or he went home right after work. Officer Gensrick stated he went to bed at approximately 2100 or 2130 hours which is his typical bedtime. Officer Gensrick stated he did not take any prescription or non-prescription medication, nor did he consume any alcoholic beverages on Tuesday.

On Wednesday, May 17th, 2023, Officer Gensrick woke up at approximately 0630 hours and began to get ready for work. At approximately 0700 hours, he left his residence and began driving to work. He arrived at the Mequon Police Department at approximately 0710-0715 hours and went through the same routine that he went through prior to his shift on Tuesday. He then waited in the locker room until approximately 0745 hours when he attended the shift roll call. At roll call he confirmed that his assignment for the day was the “cover car”. During his shift he assisted Mequon Police Department Officer Steven Beattie in taking several theft reports which were reported between the hours of 0900 and 1000 hours. Officer Gensrick stated that most of the thefts actually occurred in the Village of Thiensville, but he and Officer Beattie each took primary on one theft report that they had to narrate. After collecting the information from the victim on Officer Gensrick’s theft investigation, he returned to the Mequon Police Department to begin writing his report. Officer Gensrick recalled that the shift was relatively slow other than the theft reports. At approximately 1513 hours, he heard a call over the air dispatched to Officer Austin

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Boinski. The call was that a caller at the residence of [REDACTED] West Bonniwell Road reported that his neighbor [REDACTED] had shot at him while he was mowing the lawn. Officer Gensrick heard over the air that other officers were staging at Crossroads Church located at 6031 W Chapel Hill Rd., Mequon, WI 53097 (this address was later found by SA Walusay and was not verbally narrated by Officer Gensrick during the interview). Officer Gensrick was aware that PO Boinski had made phone contact with the original caller to get more information on the actual incident. Officer Gensrick stated he was under the impression from the dispatch that the caller was shot at while mowing the lawn, but he was not sure.

Officer Gensrick stated upon hearing the original dispatch, he was familiar with the residences and subject involved with the call. Officer Gensrick advised that he knew both the caller and the suspect by name and was particularly aware of the suspect whom he named as Pietro La Licata. Officer Gensrick stated that approximately 4-6 weeks before Wednesday 05/17/2023, he received a call from La Licata's nephew advising that La Licata was having issues with his neighbor [REDACTED]. Upon receiving the call from La Licata's nephew, Officer Gensrick responded to La Licata's residence of 3119 W. Bonniwell Road to speak with La Licata. While speaking with La Licata, La Licata reported to Officer Gensrick that he believed that the neighbors [REDACTED] were breaking his cameras and windows, knocked down his fence, and damaged one of the downspouts on his residence. Officer Gensrick checked all the areas that were reported to have been damaged or broken and determined that there was no evidence to support La Licata's claims. Officer Gensrick stated he relayed his findings and observations to La Licata and La Licata reacted appropriately to what Officer Gensrick was telling him. While La Licata was walking Officer Gensrick through the residence in order to show him all the things that he claimed to be broken, Officer Gensrick made several observations. Officer Gensrick stated La Licata did mention to him that La Licata did have several guns and cameras in the residence. Officer Gensrick observed that there were firearms in the back bedroom and noticed a television monitor with live video footage from cameras throughout the property and house. Officer Gensrick stated that there were cameras pointed towards the residence [REDACTED] La Licata. Officer Gensrick stated that he also observed that there was a window in the sunroom that did not have a screen on it. Officer Gensrick stated he specifically remembered this because this was the window that La Licata had Officer Gensrick manipulate due to La Licata's claims that the neighbors had broken the lock on it.

Officer Gensrick stated that after he spoke with La Licata, he did go to the address of [REDACTED] Bonniwell Road and spoke with the neighbors that La Licata was referencing. Officer Gensrick made contact with [REDACTED] (the original caller on 05/17/2023). Officer Gensrick stated that through his interaction with [REDACTED] approximately 4-6 weeks prior to 05/17/2023, [REDACTED] expressed that he and his wife [REDACTED] were "deathly afraid" of La Licata. They made claims that he shoots his guns in the middle of the night and recalled a specific incident where he shot two times during the night. [REDACTED] stated he believed that La Licata may

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have been shooting at animals, but he was not sure. Officer Gensrick advised the [REDACTED] family to call the police while the shooting was occurring so that they could respond.

After leaving the two residences, Officer Gensrick stated he called La Licata's nephew to discuss his concerns and the neighbors claims against La Licata. He advised the nephew that it may be in La Licata's best interest if the firearms were removed from the residence. Officer Gensrick then contacted the Ozaukee Department on Aging to make a referral on La Licata. Officer Gensrick stated he spoke with a representative of the Department on Aging, who responded to La Licata's residence the next day around 1500hours. Officer Gensrick stated Cortez called him prior to her arrival at the residence to discuss if she should bring Officer Gensrick with her to make contact with La Licata. Officer Gensrick stated he relayed his positive interaction with La Licata the day prior to Cortez and they collectively decided that Cortez would go alone, but Officer Gensrick would stay in the area. Officer Gensrick stated that since it was near the end of his shift, he advised Cortez to call the police if he needed them, and Officer Gensrick advised the dispatch center of the circumstances in the event that Cortez would need law enforcement assistance. Officer Gensrick stated that Cortez never requested him or the dispatch center for assistance while she was with La Licata, and she never reached out to Officer Gensrick for follow-up.

Officer Gensrick stated that he recalled this incident while he was on the way to the staging area on 05/17/2023, which was important because he did remember that La Licata had access to firearms, his history with his neighbors [REDACTED], and the layout of La Licata's residence. Once Officer Gensrick had arrived at the staging area, he equipped himself with his tactical vest and helmet. While he was getting ready, he was aware that Detective Lance Wegner was on the phone with La Licata's son to gather more intelligence on La Licata. Officer Gensrick stated that it was revealed that the son that Det. Wegner was originally conversing with had not been in contact with La Licata in years but did confirm that there were multiple firearms in the home. Det. Wegner then made contact with another son of La Licata's and again confirmed that there were firearms in the residence and was able to gather a valid/current phone number for La Licata.

Officer Gensrick stated that once they obtained a phone number for La Licata, they wanted to make phone contact with him. The officers on scene decided to "set up" on the residence (create a perimeter) prior to making phone contact with La Licata for fear that he would retaliate against the neighbors after being made aware of the situation by law enforcement. Officer Gensrick stated after the plan was developed, they paraded to Riverland Rd. and Bonniwell Rd. Officers Steven Beattie and Van Laanen walked east and south towards La Licata's residence. Officer Gensrick teamed up with [REDACTED] who had the drone. While they were walking Officer Gensrick advised [REDACTED] of his knowledge and history of La Licata and the [REDACTED] family, as well as a layout of La Licata's residence. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

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then used the drone to confirm where Officers Beattie and Van Laanen had set up in case they needed assistance.

Officer Gensrick was then sent to the intersection of Riverland Rd. and Bonniwell Rd. to shut down traffic. Officer Gensrick maintained this post for approximately ten minutes until Officer Stephanie Vasos (Mequon Police Department) asked him to return to the staging area, equip himself with a shield, and join Officers Beattie and Van Laanen at their post on the rear perimeter of La Licata's residence. Officer Gensrick stated he did as he was told, and he used the same path he had seen Officers Beattie and Van Laanen take (south to the clearing and then east) in order to get to their post. Upon arrival, Officer Gensrick met up with Officer Van Laanen, but did not initially see Officer Beattie. Officer Gensrick called Officer Beattie on his squad cell phone to get his location and confirmed that Beattie was to the east of Officer Gensrick and Officer Van Laanen. Officer Gensrick stayed where he was behind a tree with Officer Van Laanen.

Officer Gensrick stated that prior to getting to his post with Officer Van Laanen he had heard Officer Van Laanen call out on the radio that he had visual on a white male wearing a blue shirt and possibly khaki pants that let a dog outside through the sunroom door of La Licata's residence. Officer Gensrick estimated that he and Officer Van Laanen were approximately 60 yards away from the back of La Licata's residence and the area that Officer Van Laanen had seen the white male.

Officer Gensrick stated that he and Officer Van Laanen made the decision to observe, report, and hold their post while they waited for the Special Response Team (SRT) and an armored vehicle to arrive on scene, which PO Vasos had relayed to Officer Gensrick would be in approximately 30 minutes. Officer Gensrick told SA's that they made this decision because La Licata was ignoring phone calls that were made to him by law enforcement. Officer Gensrick relayed the information about SRT being thirty minutes out to Officer Beattie via a phone call. Officer Gensrick stated while they were waiting, he maintained his position holding his shield and standing behind the tree because he was fearful that La Licata would shoot at him based on the initial call for service that La Licata had already shot at [REDACTED] and the knowledge that Officer Gensrick had of La Licata having access to firearms.

Officer Gensrick stated that prior to SRT arrival, Officer Van Laanen, who was standing slightly in front of Officer Gensrick, told Officer Gensrick that he could see the suspect in the window of the sunroom. Officer Gensrick stated he peeked out from behind the tree that was providing him cover and observed the person matching Officer Van Laanen's earlier description of the suspect walking in the sunroom (south) towards the second or third bay window (from the southwest corner) holding a dark colored long gun. Officer Gensrick could not identify the male as La Licata at this point. Officer Gensrick stated he was aware that the window the suspect was walking towards did not have a screen, because this was the window that he had manipulated while he was in the residence with La Licata 4-6 weeks prior. Officer Gensrick stated he was

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aware that if the suspect wanted, he could just open the window and with no obstructions could shoot freely. As the suspect began opening the window, Officer Gensrick and Officer Van Laanen were both behind the tree and Officer Gensrick crouched down so that the shield was fully covering him. Officer Gensrick told SA's that the layout of the way he was positioned was in the following order: La Licata's house was approximately 60 yards to the north of them, then the tree, then Officer Van Laanen, then the shield, and then Officer Gensrick was behind the shield. After the suspect opened the window, and Officer Gensrick was already crouched down, Officer Gensrick heard 2-3 rapid in succession shots, and knew that they were coming from the sunroom towards Officer Gensrick and Officer Van Laanen because he felt the impact of dirt hitting his left shin as he heard the shots firing off. Officer Gensrick manipulated his department radio and advised all other officers that there were shots being fired at police. He then yelled out towards La Licata's residence "Pietro this is the Mequon Police Department" to see if this would stop the suspect from shooting at them. Officer Gensrick stated that his announcement did not receive a response.

When Officer Gensrick did not get a response from the shooter or anyone else in the house, he "creeped" up with his shield to view the residence through the fork of the tree he was behind. Officer Gensrick observed a subject in a blue shirt retreating from the sunroom back into the house. Officer Van Laanen then stood up and placed his rifle in the fork of the tree in order to have lethal cover on the residence. Officer Gensrick stated that as the suspect retreated further into the residence and Officer Van Laanen repositioned himself with his rifle, Officer Gensrick was trying to decide whether or not they should move locations due to already having been shot at while at their current location. Officer Gensrick believed that this meant that the suspect knew where they were and could decide to come back and continue shooting at them. As Officer Gensrick was internally weighing his options, he saw the same suspect was returning to the same bay window which was still open. Officer Gensrick stated he was aware this was the same suspect because he observed the blue shirt, he still could not positively identify this person as La Licata. Officer Gensrick moved so that he was again behind the tree and shield fully for cover because he had assumed that the subject was still armed. Officer Gensrick stated that Officer Van Laanen maintained his position with lethal cover on the residence. Officer Gensrick then heard one shot that he knows came from Officer Van Laanen's rifle due to his proximity to Officer Van Laanen.

After Officer Van Laanen fired the single shot, both Officer Gensrick and Officer Van Laanen attempted to key up their radios to advise other officers, but they both keyed up at the same time and ended up covering each other. Officer Gensrick stated that he decided to allow Officer Van Laanen to control the radio traffic due to Officer Van Laanen's vantage point. Officer Van Laanen then called out over the radio that he had fired one shot, the suspect was down, and no longer in sight. After Officer Van Laanen's radio transmission, Officer Gensrick peeked towards the residence again and saw an object poking out of the sunroom open window, he could not

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positively identify the object but believed it may have been a firearm. Officer Gensrick no longer could see the suspect. Once Officer Gensrick observed that the suspect was no longer in view, he and Officer Van Laanen moved to the west side of the tree line to the northwest of their previous location in order to meet up with the rest of the team with their shield.

Once they arrived at the northwest tree line, Officer Gensrick was checked out by a deputy for any injuries and was determined to be "ok". Officer Gensrick then handed his shield off to the deputy and it was shortly thereafter determined that Officer Gensrick should be taken out of service. Officer Gensrick then walked back to the original staging area and then eventually drove to the Mequon Police Department. Once he arrived at the police department, he had a weapons and injury check. Officer Gensrick stated at this time he checked his left shin and saw the dirt that had flown up onto his pant leg but determined that he had not been struck by the ammunition as there were no injuries to the area.

At the end of Officer Gensrick's statement he advised SA's that he was wearing his body worn camera, but that it had run out of battery before he even arrived at Officer Van Laanen's post behind the tree. He stated he made the fact that his body camera was out of commission clear to several officers and advised Officer Van Laanen when he arrived to his location.

This ended Officer Gensrick's statement.

It should be noted that during the interview, SA's provided PO Gensrick with a printed off map of the incident location. PO Gensrick used a sharpie marker to depict where he was on the map. PO Gensrick signed and dated the map. The map that was used was scanned in as an attachment to this report.

On Wednesday, May 31st, 2023, SA Walusay and SA Jones met with Officer Brian Gensrick and his legal representation, Attorney William Rettko, at Rettko Law Offices, S.C. located at 15460 W. Capitol Drive, Brookfield, WI 53005. SA's Walusay and Jones arrived at the office at approximately 0900 hours and provided a copy of this report to Officer Gensrick and Attorney Rettko. SA's then left the conference room in order for Officer Gensrick to review the report with his attorney. At approximately 0940hours, SA Walusay and SA Jones were summoned back into the conference room. At which time, Officer Gensrick provided SA Walusay with the copy of the report with a few minor grammatical changes. These changes were made to the report on 05/31/23 at approximately 1245hours.

On 05/17/2023, Wisconsin (WI) Department of Justice (DOJ)- Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) Special Agent (SA) Kadija Walusay conducted an interview of a law enforcement officer that was present for an officer-involved critical incident that occurred on 05/17/2023 at 3119 West Bonniwell Road, City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin.

SA Walusay was assigned to interview Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office Sergeant (Sgt.) Becky Ronan (previously Becky Swanson, clarification due to the last name Swanson being used in other reports referencing Sgt. Ronan). The interview was conducted at the Mequon Police Department in a vacant office.

INTERVIEW OF SERGEANT BECKY RONAN

On 05/17/2023, at approximately 2128hours, SA Walusay and WIDJ-DCI SA Christina M. McNichol met with Sgt. Ronan in the common area of the police department and walked to the vacant office space. SA Walusay and SA McNichol introduced themselves to Sgt. Ronan and Sgt. Ronan agreed to speak with SA Walusay and SA McNichol. It should be noted that SA's did not record the interview with Sgt. Ronan.

Sgt. Ronan stated she has been a sworn member of the Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office for 14 years and has had no prior sworn law enforcement jobs. Sgt. Ronan's current assignment is a [REDACTED] shift patrol sergeant, and she has a K9 partner "Rev". Sgt. Ronan works a rotating work shift, [REDACTED] days on shift and [REDACTED] days off, with Wednesday (05/17/2023) being her [REDACTED] day on the shift rotation. Sgt. Ronan's regular working hours are [REDACTED] hours until [REDACTED] hours. Sgt. Ronan she began her [REDACTED] shift at 0745hours on 05/17/2023.

Sgt. Ronan stated that her shift prior to the officer-involved critical incident on Bonniwell Road was normal. She stated that just prior to 1513hours, she had gone to the highway department to fill her squad with gas and was on her way back to the Sheriff's Office. Sgt. Ronan stated this is when she heard the initial call to Mequon Police over the radio. Sgt. Ronan stated upon hearing the call, she thought to herself that the details met the criteria for a Special Response Team (SRT) call. Sgt. Ronan is a member of the county's SRT so she began responding to the staging area of Crossroads Church located at 6031 W Chapel Hill Rd., Mequon, WI 53097. Sgt. Ronan stated while at the staging area, she met with Mequon Police Detectives Cory Polshinski and Lance Wagner. Sgt. Ronan did not receive an assignment but joined a large contingency of law enforcement as they left they left the staging area and headed to the intersection of Riverland Road and Bonniwell Road. While on the way, Sgt. Ronan observed a bus that was blocking the roadway. Sgt. Ronan then went to the front of the convoy to address the bus and ask it to move out of the roadway. As the convoy continued, Sgt. Ronan became the lead vehicle.

Once Sgt. Ronan reached the intersection Riverland Rd. and Bonniwell Rd., she began "game planning" with Police Officer (PO) Stephanie Vasos of the Mequon Police Department. Sgt. Ronan became aware that Officers Steven Beattie and William Van Laanen of the Mequon Police Department were posted behind the target house. Sgt. Ronan stated after conferring with PO Vasos, they sent Officer Brian Gensrick of the Mequon Police Department to join Officers Beattie and Van Laanen at their post. Sgt. Ronan then sent Officer Matthew Bottoni and Officer

Boinski of the Mequon Police Department to the house across the street (north) of the target residence. PO Bottoni was tasked with surveilling the target residence with binoculars. [REDACTED] arrived at the staging area with a drone and Sgt. Ronan had talks with him about the possibility of deploying it over the target residence. Sgt. Ronan also conferred about paging SRT to deploy for the incident. At this time, Sgt. Ronan heard over the radio that the officers on the rear perimeter of the residence advised that they could see the subject in the rear porch (sunroom) area and that he was armed. Sgt. Ronan stated that almost immediately after that radio transmission, she heard (3) gun shots consecutively within a "half second" of each other. Sgt. Ronan had been standing with PO Vasos, Deputy Ganey, and Deputy Wade Navis. The group ran east through the yards (which she depicted on a map of the area), and stopped by a fence near an outbuilding. As they arrived, Sgt. Ronan heard three or four more shots that sounded the same as the first three shots she had heard, and in the same cadence. Sgt. Ronan stated her group continued towards the area of the target residence and while they were heading in that direction, she heard a single shot that sounded different from the first two sets of shots. She stated this shot seemed deeper and sounded more like a "thud". Sgt. Ronan stated she heard over the air that officers had confirmed that they had announced the presence of police to the suspect.

After the single shot was heard, Sgt. Ronan's group continued their movements towards the three Mequon Police Department officers (unknown to her at the time), who were staged on the rear perimeter of the residence. Sgt. Ronan stated that two of the officers were standing together behind a tree, and the third was a little bit away from the first two, east of the tree using an outbuilding as cover. Sgt. Ronan stated she and [REDACTED] took a prone position near the two officers by the tree and held long cover on the target residence [REDACTED]. While she was holding long cover on the residence, Sgt. Ronan stated she observed that the second window in from the SW corner of the target residence was open. She observed a rifle hanging out the open window, she stated the window did not have a screen on it, and the barrel of the rifle was sticking out of the window with the rest of the gun laying on the window sill. The rifle was pointed west and she did not observe anybody near the rifle.

Sgt. Ronan stated that while she was posted on the target residence, she was told to wait there while SRT convened at the staging area of Bonniwell Rd. and Riverland Rd. SRT then deployed the drone that had been left behind at the staging area by [REDACTED]. The drone was eventually deployed and piloted by [REDACTED] on the SRT and was successful in obtaining visual of the target residence. Sgt. Ronan stated once the drone had visual of the target residence, she was made aware that the suspect was "down". Sgt. Ronan stayed in her position until two unknown snipers relieved her of her post. At the time that she was relieved, she and [REDACTED] joined SRT on a perimeter team. She observed other SRT members in a small armored vehicle (which Sgt. Ronan referred to as a PIG) approach the house, and members of the team that were in the PIG broke the glass door into the sunroom. After the door was broken, Sgt. Ronan's team followed the first contact team and made entry into the residence. Sgt. Ronan stated that the SRT had a Tactical Emergency Medical personnel, Nurse Richard Boeshaar, with

them as they deployed (Sgt. Ronan explained to SA's that she referred to this person as "Doc" and that "Doc" was actually a nurse with Aurora).

Sgt. Ronan stated her upon her entry into the residence through the sunroom she observed that the suspect was "down", had an [REDACTED], and looked [REDACTED] to her. She stated she was made aware somehow that the subject was actually deceased, and she knew that the "Doc" with the SRT had "[REDACTED]" and verified that there were no signs of life. Sgt. Ronan stated the suspect was laying on the ground on his back. The suspects feet were to the west and his head was to the east. Sgt. Ronan drew a depiction of where she observed the suspects body to be laying and the directional orientation of the body that she observed.

Sgt. Ronan and the rest of the SRT continued clearing the residence. While clearing the sunroom, Sgt. Ronan stated she observed the rifle in the window that she had observed earlier while she was in the rear perimeter of the residence. She also observed another rifle leaned up against the western most window that was closed. She observed a black rifle that was leaned up against the door that lead from the sunroom into the house; the door was located directly behind the open window that had the rifle sticking out of it.

After clearing the sunroom, they began clearing the rest of the residence. Sgt. Ronan stated she did not observe other citizens in the residence besides the decedent. Sgt. Ronan stated that in the living room she observed a revolver sitting on the coffee table and a rifle leaning against a recliner. Sgt. Ronan observed a friendly blue heeler dog in the living room. She stated other team members eventually locked the dog in the garage while they continued to clear the residence and made it safe. Sgt. Ronan stated she did observe this same dog in the residence while she was on the rear perimeter.

After the residence was cleared, they began clearing the outbuildings and vehicles on the property. At no point did Sgt. Ronan observe any other people in the residence or on the property besides the decedent.

While the team members were clearing the residence, the "doc" stayed with the decedent. After the residence was cleared, Sgt. Ronan stayed in the northwest part of the driveway as scene security until she was summoned to report to the Mequon Police department.

Sgt. Ronan stated that throughout the incident she did not discharge any firearms, and she was not injured in any way. She further stated that the video in her squad was activated, but her squad was left at the staging area for the majority of the incident. She also noted that she did not have any audio on her squad video. She stated she was wearing her body worn camera and she had initiated it as she initially responded to the staging area. She stated throughout the whole incident she knows that the camera had turned on and off several times, with one reason being that she was laying prone during the portion of the incident. Sgt. Ronan further stated that her K9 partner had stayed in her vehicle for the entirety of the incident.

Sgt. Ronan had nothing further to add.

It should be noted that at no point during the interview with Sgt. Ronan did she refer to the decedent by his name of Pietro La Licata. For the purpose of clarity, any use of the words decedent or suspect in this report were made in reference to Pietro La Licata who is the lone resident of 3119 West Bonniwell Rd.

During the interview, Sgt. Ronan used (2) printed maps to draw on that were provided to her by SA's. She used one to depict the path that she took in order to respond on foot to the target residence, and the other to depict where she observed the suspect to be laying when she made initial entry into the residence. All printed maps that were used in the interview were attached to this report.

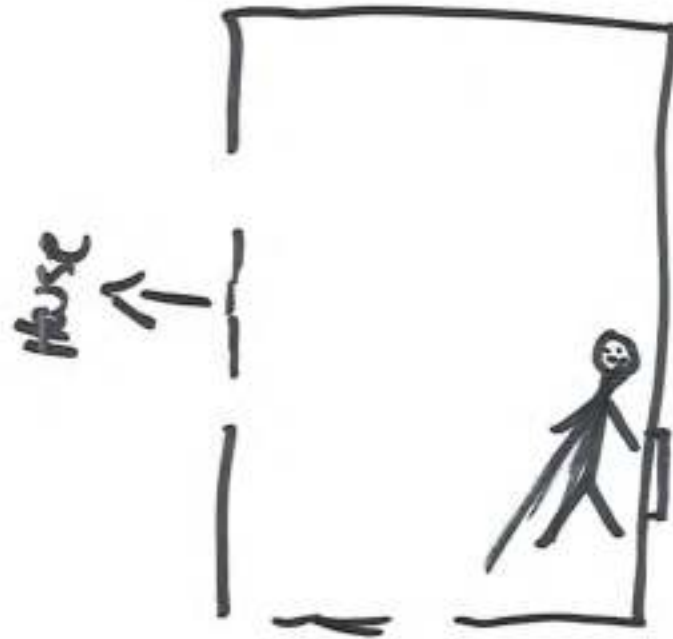

ACTIVITY

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, the Wisconsin Department of Justice - Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ-DCI) was requested by the Mequon Police Department (MUPD) to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred in the City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, WI. The initial information provided was that a MUPD police officer discharged their firearm at a subject during an incident. The subject was later identified as Pietro La Licata (hereafter referred to as Pietro), M/U, DOB: [REDACTED] and the incident occurred at a residence at 3119 W Bonniwell Road, Mequon, WI 53097. WI DOJ-DCI Special Agent (SA) Jacob Chihak, along with other WI DOJ-DCI agents, responded to assist with the OICI investigation.

SA Chihak was tasked with collecting written statements from members of the Ozaukee County Metro Special Response Team (Ozaukee Metro Special Response Team) at the incident command post located at the Crossroads Presbyterian Church, located at 6031 W Chapel Hill Road, City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin 53097.

UNIFORM AND WEAPON INSPECTION

At about 8:15 PM, SA Chihak met with Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office (OZSO) Lieutenant (LT) Chad Eibs. LT Eibs collected written statements (19 total) from members of the Ozaukee Metro Special Response Team and turned them over to SA Chihak. SA Chihak collected 1 of the 19 statements on May 18, 2023, from OZSO LT Eibs at the OZSO, 1201 S Spring Street, Port Washington, WI 53074.

ACTIVITY

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, the Wisconsin Department of Justice - Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ-DCI) was requested by the Mequon Police Department (MUPD) to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred in the City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, WI. The initial information provided was that a MUPD police officer discharged their firearm at a subject during an incident. The subject was later identified as Pietro La Licata, M/U, DOB: [REDACTED] and the incident occurred at a residence at 3119 W Bonniwell Road, Mequon, WI 53097. WI DOJ-DCI Special Agent (SA) Jacob Chihak, along with other WI DOJ-DCI agents, responded to assist with the OICI investigation.

SA Chihak was tasked with conducting a uniform and weapon inspection of an external ballistic vest and duty rifle deployed by Mequon Police Department (MUPD) Police Officer (PO) Steven Beattie. PO Beattie was not present during the inspection. SA Chihak conducted the uniform and weapon inspection at the incident command post located at the Crossroads Presbyterian Church, located at 6031 W Chapel Hill Road, City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin 53097.

UNIFORM AND WEAPON INSPECTION

At about 9 PM, SA Chihak spoke with MUPD Captain Mark Riley and MUPD Sergeant Lindsay Graycarek who reported Captain Riley had a vest and duty rifle deployed by MUPD PO Beattie during the incident secured in Captain Riley's squad in the parking lot at the Crossroads Presbyterian Church, located at 6031 W Chapel Hill Road, City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin 53097. Sergeant Graycarek explained MUPD Detective Sean Kilpatrick brought the vest and rifle to the church parking lot after PO Beattie placed the ballistic vest and duty rifle in the rear of a gold MUPD detective squad following the incident. Sergeant Graycarek advised MUPD detectives shared several squads so the squads were not assigned to specific detectives. Sergeant Graycarek indicated the gold detective squad where the vest and rifle were first secured was initially driven to the area of the incident by MUPD Detective Cory Polishinski and MUPD Detective Charles O'Connell. Sergeant Graycarek advised after the incident, PO Beattie placed the ballistic vest and rifle in the rear of the squad and Detective Kilpatrick brought the items to the church parking lot.

SA Chihak met with Captain Riley at Captain Riley's squad. Captain Riley turned over one duty rifle, one external ballistic vest (which had two rifle magazines and two pistol magazines), a ballistic helmet, one rifle magazine, and one live rifle round. SA Chihak took 27 photographs of PO Beattie's ballistic vest, duty rifle, rifle magazines, and rifle ammunition.

The rifle was identified as a Colt AR-15A3 Tactical Carbine .223 caliber rifle with Serial Number LBD044268 with a Streamlight flashlight at the barrel and a pressure switch to activate

the flashlight and an Aimpoint Patrol Rifle Optic. The rifle stock had the identifier "SQ 5" written on it. SA Chihak confirmed each of the three rifle magazines were 30-round capacity PMAG magazines and each contained 28 live rounds of ammunition. Two of the three rifle magazines were in pouches on the external ballistic vest. MUPD PO Michael Brandemuehl confirmed each MUPD duty rifle magazine should contain 28 rounds.

SA Chihak examined the external ballistic vest and identified the following items from left to right (while looking at the vest) on the front of the vest: a zippered throw pouch with a tourniquet inside; a body camera bracket (with no body camera attached); a double rifle magazine holder which contained two loaded rifle magazines with a double pistol magazine holder which contained two loaded pistol magazines attached. A large patch with the word "POLICE" was on the front chest area of the vest above the items described above. A large patch with the word "POLICE" was also affixed to the rear of the vest in the upper back portion of the vest. The ballistic helmet was black with a chin strap. SA Chihak confirmed each of the two pistol magazines were 17-round capacity 9mm Glock magazines and each contained 17 rounds.

SA Chihak spoke with Sergeant Graycarek about the live round with the rifle. Initially Sergeant Graycarek believed it was from the duty rifle deployed by PO Beattie as it was found near the gold squad. However, Sergeant Graycarek later determined the live round came from a separate duty rifle deployed by Detective O'Connell. Detective O'Connell reported ejecting two live rounds from his duty rifle after he deployed it; one which he recovered the other which was left on the ground near the gold squad.

EVIDENCE and DISPOSITION

The photographs taken by SA Chihak remained in the exclusive custody of SA Chihak until they were uploaded and placed in DCI Records folder on May 22, 2023, which was created for the Officer Involved Death investigation. The one duty rifle, one external ballistic vest (which had two rifle magazines and two pistol magazines), a ballistic helmet, one rifle magazine, and one live rifle round were left with Captain Riley.

INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]:

On Thursday, May 18, 2023, at 12:59 PM, SA Chihak interviewed [REDACTED] via telephone. SA Chihak included DCI Victim Services Specialist (VSS) Jacqueline Larsen in the phone call during the initial portion of the interview. After providing some initial information about information regarding Pietro's beneficiary and trust arrangements, SA Chihak spoke with [REDACTED] about his relationship with Pietro.

[REDACTED] advised while growing up, he hunted and fished with Pietro. [REDACTED] indicated for the last couple months, he became much closer to Pietro after Pietro asked [REDACTED] for some help. [REDACTED] advised he began helping his uncle, Pietro, with paying bills. [REDACTED] reported a couple months prior to May 2023, Pietro contacted [REDACTED] and said there was a "falling out" between Pietro and his children. [REDACTED] explained Pietro cried when Pietro first told [REDACTED] about the falling out. [REDACTED] advised Pietro claimed not to trust the children. [REDACTED] indicated he encouraged Pietro to restore Pietro's relationship with Pietro's children.

[REDACTED] advised he ([REDACTED]) continued helping Pietro with bills as well as changing locks at the residence and changing access to Pietro's security cameras. ██████████ indicated one of the things Pietro was upset about reference Pietro's son, ██████████ (██████████ La Licata), was that ██████████ sold some hunting land near Mequon or Port Washington that Pietro enjoyed using for hunting. ██████████ advised Pietro gave the family cement business to ██████████. ██████████ explained Pietro claimed Pietro's other son, ██████████, stole things when at Pietro's residence. ██████████ indicated Pietro was upset with Pietro's daughter, ██████████, because of some hearing aids purchased from Costco which resulted in some returned money which ██████████ took.

██████████ advised Pietro's other daughter, ██████████, briefly lived with Pietro. ██████████ indicated Pietro reported ██████████ stole money, "messed with" Pietro's dog, and "came at" Pietro at one point. ██████████ further described the incident when ██████████ "came at" Pietro as explained by Pietro. ██████████ indicated Pietro had a "boat load of guns". ██████████ advised Pietro was a "really good shot". ██████████ indicated it was unusual for Pietro miss while hunting or target shooting. ██████████ was unsure if Pietro shot firearms at Pietro's residence but noted ██████████ sometimes saw .22 caliber shells around the residence.

██████████ did not report and mental health issues with Pietro. ██████████ noted Pietro would never commit suicide. ██████████ explained Pietro recently put money into a certificate of deposit (CD) at a local bank which meant that Pietro intended to receive the money from the investment.

Further, SA Higgins observed a memo book in the right leg pocket of Van Laanen's uniform pants. Van Laanen further possessed a pair of tactical duty gloves, in his rear pants pocket. During the time of the inspection, Van Laanen did not have a patrol rifle or body camera on his person.

SA McNichol inspected Van Laanen's duty belt and noted the following equipment, logged counter clockwise from the buckle:

- Squad keys
- Taser (marked #4), serial #X30007XKF
- Flashlight inside of pouch
- OC inside of pouch
- Handcuff pouch containing two handcuffs

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at approximately 9:37PM, Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) Special Agent (SA) Todd Higgins, along with DCI Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Tamara Taubel, conducted an interview of Mequon Police Department Detective (Det) Lance Wegner. The interview of Wegner took place in a conference room of the Mequon Police Department, located at 11300N. Buntrock Ave., Mequon. Det Wegner provided the following information:

Det Wegner has been employed by the Mequon Police Department for approximately 26 years. Det Wegner is currently assigned to the [REDACTED] shift Detective Bureau. Det Wegner typically works the [REDACTED] shift.

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, Det Wegner indicated that he responded to a neighbor dispute/shots fired complaint, later determined to have occurred at 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd., Mequon. Det Wegner was unsure of the exact time of his response to the incident. Det Wegner indicated that he initially responded to the incident with Mequon Police Department Det Sean Kilpatrick.

During the initial response, Det Wegner established a staging area at the Crossroads Church, which Det Wegner indicated was near the suspect residence. After establishing a staging area, Det Wegner and other law enforcement officers responded to the intersection of Bonniwell Rd. and Riverland Rd., which is the intersection directly west of the suspect residence. Det. Wegner indicated that he was familiar with the suspect/homeowner later identified as Pietro La Licata, and knew where La Licata resided. While at the intersection, Det Wegner stated a perimeter was established around La Licata's residence. Det Wegner advised two officers deployed to the front of the residence, along with three officers who were deployed to the rear of the residence. Det Wegner advised that officers who deployed to the rear of the residence included Mequon Police Department PO William Van Laanen and Mequon Police Department PO Steven Beattie, followed a short time later by Mequon Police Department PO Brian Gensrick. Det Wegner indicated that officers initially planned to establish a perimeter around the suspect's residence, in attempts to gather more intelligence, until the Special Response Team (SRT/tactical unit) arrived on scene.

After a perimeter was established, Det Wegner maintained his position at the intersection of Bonniwell Rd. and Riverland Rd. While at the intersection, Det Wegner heard radio traffic, believed to be from Van Laanen, informing that he (Van Laanen) observed a subject, standing near the window, and that the subject had a gun. A short time later, Det Wegner indicated he heard a single (1) gun shot. During that time, Det Wegner indicated he heard radio traffic, believed to be from Van Laanen, stating "He just shot at me." Approximately 5 seconds later, Det Wegner heard (2) additional gun shots, followed by another single (1) gunshot. After this, radio traffic indicated that officers could no longer see the suspect.

After hearing gunfire, Det Wegner stated that four officers, including Mequon Police Department PO Stephanie Vasos, and three deputies from the Ozaukee County Sheriff's Department,

responded from the intersection, on foot east, towards the rear of the residence. Some of the officers were equipped with ballistic shields. The group of four officers were followed by Det. Wegner and Det. Kilpatrick.

Upon making contact with officers situated at the rear of the residence, Det Wegner made contact with PO Van Laanen. PO Van Laanen advised Det Wegner that he (Van Laanen) took fire, possibly from a shotgun, and that Van Laanen had returned fire. Det Wegner noted that Van Laanen had taken cover behind a tree, and Det Wegner observed damage to that tree, which Det Wegner thought was from the rounds fired by the suspect. Van Laanen stated the damaged tree, where Van Laanen took cover, was approximately 90 yards from the suspect's residence.

Det Wegner advised that officers maintained their positions, as the suspect could not be observed. A drone was subsequently deployed, and the suspect was located and observed to be down. The residence and suspect were subsequently secured by SRT.

WI DOJ-DCI Special Agent (S/A) Neal R Lofy was tasked with conducting an interview of a law enforcement officer that was present for the OICI. The law enforcement officer was identified as Ozaukee County Sheriff's Deputy [REDACTED] and the interview was conducted at the Mequon Police Department in an open room located in the detective bureau.

INTERVIEW OF DEPUTY MICHAEL GANEY:

On 05/17/2023, at 9:38pm, S/A Lofy and WI DOJ-DCI S/A Mitch Ward met with [REDACTED] in a common area of the police department and walked to the detective bureau to utilize an open room for the interview. S/A Lofy and S/A Ward introduced themselves to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] agreed to speak with S/A Lofy and S/A Ward.

[REDACTED] had been with the Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office for nine (9) years [REDACTED] was a patrol deputy on [REDACTED] shift and was currently serving as a field training officer to Deputy Wade Navis, who was currently in the shadow phase of the field training program. The shadow phase of field training was the last phase prior to a trainee exiting the field training program and operating without a field trainer. [REDACTED] stated his normal hours were [REDACTED] and he was assigned [REDACTED] hours on 05/17/2023. [REDACTED] and Deputy Navis were operating [REDACTED], computer number [REDACTED], and radio number [REDACTED].

S/A Lofy asked [REDACTED] about his shift prior to the OICI, and he stated the shift was steady but average for a typical day. [REDACTED] explained that Deputy Navis was driving, and [REDACTED] was wearing plain clothing and not in a patrol deputy's uniform because he was shadowing Deputy Navis for the day.

S/A Lofy asked [REDACTED] how he was alerted to the initial incident on Bonniwell Road and [REDACTED] stated that at approximately 3:15pm, dispatch advised over the radio that the Mequon Police Department was responding to a location where a reporting party was indicating that they had been shot at by their neighbor while the reporting party was cutting their grass. [REDACTED] and Deputy Navis started to respond to the area of the initial incident and, while enroute, they were advised by dispatch to shut down traffic at Bonniwell Road and Riverland Road.

[REDACTED] exited the patrol vehicle, retrieved and put on a ballistic vest, helmet, and deployed the patrol rifle.

[REDACTED] launched a drone, flew it towards and around the property of 3119 Bonniwell Road. [REDACTED] observed a vehicle in the driveway but did not see anything else around the house while he circled 3119 Bonniwell Road with the drone. [REDACTED] flew the drone back to Bonniwell Road and Riverland Road where he landed the drone.

[REDACTED] assisted Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office Sergeant (Sgt.) Becky Ronan with the coordination of responding officers to establish a perimeter around 3119 Bonniwell Road. [REDACTED] could also see that there was a dog in the sunroom and observed another drone circling the house. Sgt. Ronan and [REDACTED] held this position until relieved by SRT members.

[REDACTED] then joined up with SRT members approaching the rear of the house. SRT breeched the glass door and as [REDACTED] entered the sunroom, he observed a male subject, with [REDACTED] around him, down on the ground with a shotgun next to him. On 05/22/2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice – Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ-DCI) Special Agent (S/A) Courtney R. Bauer assisted with the interview of a law enforcement officer that was involved in an officer-involved critical incident (OICI) that occurred on 05/17/2023. The incident occurred in the area of 3119 West Bonniwell Road, City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin.

S/A Bauer and S/A Shannon D. Jones were assigned to interview Mequon Police Department (MUPD) Police Officer Steven G. Beattie on 05/22/2023. The interview was conducted in a conference room at the WI DOJ-DCI Milwaukee Field Office, located at [REDACTED], Brookfield, Wisconsin. Also present for the interview was Attorney William R. Rettko of Rettko Law Offices, S.C. Officer Beattie did not request the presence of any additional personnel.

INTERVIEW OF OFFICER STEVEN G. BEATTIE

On 05/22/2023, at approximately 1:00 p.m., S/A Jones and S/A Bauer introduced themselves to Officer Beattie and Attorney Rettko in the conference room located within the WI DOJ-DCI Milwaukee Field Office. S/A Jones advised Officer Beattie that he was not compelled to make a statement about the incident and that the statement had to be voluntary. Officer Beattie indicated he would provide S/A Jones and S/A Bauer a statement.

BACKGROUND AND TRAINING

Officer Beattie attended the University of Wisconsin – Eau Claire (UWEC) and obtained his Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice in December 2012. Officer Beattie attended the 520-hour Basic Law Enforcement Academy at Western Technical College in La Crosse, Wisconsin and graduated in Fall 2014. Officer Beattie stated he was hired by the Juneau County Sheriff's Office (JUSO) as a limited term deputy sheriff in May 2015 and served the JUSO until September 2015. In October 2015, Officer Beattie started full-time employment with the Sauk County Sheriff's Office (SASO) as a deputy sheriff. In May 2017, Officer Beattie left the SASO for employment as a full-time police officer with the MUPD. Officer Beattie stated he last qualified with his service weapon and rifle in Summer 2022 but completed more departmental firearms training in February 2023.

Officer Beattie stated he has held the position of police officer at MUPD since his hire in May 2017. Officer Beattie stated he had attended training to become a field training officer (FTO) in Fall 2022. He stated he did not have any additional specialized training or certifications.

Officer Beattie stated he was assigned call number 923. He stated he was stationed out of the MUPD, which was located at 11300 North Buntrock Avenue, Mequon, Wisconsin; however, his beat assignment within the city varied by day. Officer Beattie stated his on/off day cycle was a [REDACTED] rotation with [REDACTED] days on shift and [REDACTED] days off shift. He stated he was assigned to [REDACTED] shift which began at [REDACTED] a.m. and ended at [REDACTED] p.m. On the day of the incident, Officer Beattie stated he was working dayshift and was on the [REDACTED] day of his "on" rotation. He stated on that

day he was assigned to the 3-5 beat, which was the west car that covered the west side of the City of Mequon. He stated it was 50 to 60 degrees F and partly sunny during his shift.

EVENTS PRIOR TO THE INCIDENT

Officer Beattie stated the day before the incident (05/16/2023) he had worked [REDACTED] shift and had ended his shift on time ([REDACTED] p.m.). He stated he returned home after his shift, made dinner for his wife and children, and ate dinner. Officer Beattie stated he may have had one beer prior to going to bed. He stated [REDACTED] between 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. and he went to bed at approximately 10:00 p.m. Officer Beattie stated he slept through the night and woke up to his alarm at 6:00 a.m., [REDACTED]. He stated he got out of bed, got ready for work, had a cup of coffee, and left the house for the MUPD at approximately 6:50 a.m.

Officer Beattie stated he arrived at the police department at approximately 7:20 a.m. or 7:25 a.m. and dressed for shift. After putting his uniform on, Officer Beattie went to the patrol room and grabbed a taser and body camera and replaced his radio battery. Officer Beattie stated he was present for roll call, which started at 7:45 a.m.

Officer Beattie stated there were numerous theft complaints during the shift and that he and MUPD Police Officer Brian Gensrick handled “a few” theft investigations during the morning hours of their shift. Officer Beattie estimated the theft investigations lasted until approximately 12:00 p.m. Officer Beattie stated his shift sergeants were not working that day, so Officer Stephanie Vasos was the acting supervisor; therefore, “everyone was trying to lay low.”

Officer Beattie stated at approximately 3:13 p.m. he was at the Mequon Nature Preserve, located near County Line Road and Swan Road, when he heard dispatch alert the east squad, MUPD Police Officer Austin Boinski, to a call for “neighbor trouble” where a neighbor fired a gun at another neighbor. Officer Beattie stated dispatch provided the reporting party’s address, which was [REDACTED] West Bonniwell Road. Officer Beattie stated his location was a distance from the address on West Bonniwell Road, so he responded emergent towards that location. He stated Officer Boinski broadcasted over the radio for all responding law enforcement to respond to Crossroads Church for staging in order to formulate a plan for their approach.

Officer Beattie stated he was familiar with the addresses involved prior to the call for service. He stated he did not recall ever responding to either address ([REDACTED] West Bonniwell Road or 3119 West Bonniwell Road) but knew other officers that had. He stated Officer Boinski had made contact with the residents at [REDACTED] West Bonniwell Road in the past for hunting and trespassing complaints and Officer Gensrick had made contact with the resident at 3119 West Bonniwell approximately one month earlier for a welfare check. Officer Beattie stated the welfare check was due to neighbor complaints regarding the resident of 3119 West Bonniwell Road firing guns at night. Officer Beattie did not know which neighbor or neighbors had made that complaint but

stated Officer Gensrick had “made the number of firearms in the residence known” and stated the resident’s mental health was in question.

ARRIVAL AT STAGING (CROSSROADS CHURCH)

Officer Beattie stated when he arrived at Crossroads Church there were already multiple MUPD squads there, to include other patrol squads and detective squads. He recalled Officer Boinski made phone contact with the reporting party to obtain more information about what had occurred that day (05/17/2023). Officer Beattie stated Detective (Det.) Lance Wegner made phone contact with the suspect’s family to obtain further information about the suspect and the residence. It should be noted, the suspect was identified as Pietro La Licata; however, during the interview, Officer Beattie did not know the suspect’s name, only that it “sounded like Peter,” so that was how he referred to the suspect throughout the interview.

Officer Beattie stated while they were attempting to gather intelligence a sergeant from the Ozaukee County Sheriff’s Office (OZSO) responded to the church and an OZSO deputy sheriff responded to the intersection of West Bonniwell Road and Riverland Road to block traffic.

Officer Beattie stated the officers at Crossroads Church devised a plan to respond to the area of 3119 West Bonniwell Road, the suspect’s location, set up a perimeter around the residence, and then attempt phone contact with the suspect. Officer Beattie led the caravan of squads to the area of 3119 West Bonniwell Road, driving north on Green Bay Road then east on West Bonniwell Road. Officer Beattie stated he parked in the driveway of a farm on the south side of West Bonniwell Road west of 3119 West Bonniwell Road. He stated when he pulled into that driveway the homeowner had just arrived at the farm, so he made contact with her and told her to go to her basement for her safety.

ARRIVAL ON SCENE

Officer Beattie stated after he had spoken with the farm’s homeowner, he and MUPD Police Officer William Van Laanen walked south and east towards the rear of the residence at 3119 West Bonniwell Road. He stated as they were walking, they stopped near some brush southwest of the residence and Officer Van Laanen utilized a cellular phone to confirm via Google Maps they were near the correct residence. Officer Beattie stated Google Maps showed heavy brush between [REDACTED] West Bonniwell Road and 3119 West Bonniwell Road so the original plan was for the two officers to position themselves between the two addresses using the trees as cover; however, the officers observed the trees to have been cut down in that area negating any cover. Because of the lack of cover at their original location, both officers proceeded to a large tree, but Officer Beattie stated that tree only provided cover for one officer, so he continued east to “get eyes on” the east side of the residence. Officer Beattie stated Officer Van Laanen stayed at the tree and he continued up the ridge behind a pole building where he could see the east side of the residence. Officer Beattie stated he stayed behind the pole building for a short time then moved northeast of the pole barn behind a gravel pile. He stated he laid prone behind the gravel pile

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facing northwest. Officer Beattie stated from that position he was no longer able to see Officer Van Laanen but he could see more of the residence to include the concrete patio and steps and the basement egress on the south side of the residence, as well as all of the east side of the residence. Officer Beattie stated he was wearing his ballistic vest and ballistic helmet and had his rifle with him.

Officer Beattie stated he stayed behind the gravel pile for approximately forty-five minutes and received period updates on his squad cell phone from Officer Gensrick. He also stated he heard that Officer Gensrick would be coming to their position with a ballistic shield but did not recall who had said that. Officer Beattie stated Officer Gensrick called him when he got to Officer Gensrick's position to verify Officer Beattie's location. Officer Beattie stated Officer Gensrick stayed with Officer Van Laanen and never made it to his position. He also stated he was made aware that Officer Boinski and Officer Matthew Bottoni were north of his position. Officer Beattie stated though he knew they were supposed to be north of him he never saw them or made any contact with them. Officer Beattie stated the plan while in their positions was to stay there until the Ozaukee County Special Response Team (SRT) arrived on scene.

While Officer Beattie was positioned behind the gravel pile, he observed a dog in the suspect's backyard. Officer Beattie stated he did not see a human or the dog being let out of the house, he only saw the dog in the yard and then it "disappeared." Officer Beattie also recalled Officer Van Laanen giving a description of a male subject in the residence but could not recall what the description was. Officer Beattie stated he determined the description was of the suspect because the intelligence they had previously gathered was there was only one person in the residence, the suspect.

Officer Beattie stated "nothing happened" for what felt like twenty minutes while he was prone behind the gravel pile, then he heard Officer Van Laanen or Officer Gensrick broadcast they could see the subject in the sunroom. Officer Beattie stated he could "peek" and see "glimpses" of the sunroom. He stated he metered, while prone, slightly to the north in order to see part of the sunroom. Officer Beattie stated he could see more of the east exterior side of the sunroom but could see some of the south exterior sunroom; however, due to the glare on the window, he was unable to see into the room. Once in the position to see those angles of the sunroom, Officer Beattie stated he observed the barrel of a black gun, which he thought was a rifle, sticking out of a south facing window of the sunroom. Officer Beattie stated the barrel was not pointed at him, but it was pointed in the direction that he knew Officer Van Laanen and Officer Gensrick were located. Officer Beattie recalled hearing three shots fired, not in rapid succession, but one right after the other. Officer Beattie stated "there was no doubt in his mind" the shots were being fired from the house in the direction of Officer Van Laanen and Officer Gensrick. Officer Beattie recalled observing the gun barrel retract after the three gunshots. Officer Beattie stated he stood up and moved south to where he had initially been located behind the gravel pile in order to "get eyes on" Officer Van Laanen and Officer Gensrick. Officer Beattie stated he was able to see they were "okay."

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Officer Beattie stated while he was repositioning in order to see Officer Van Laanen and Officer Gensrick, at some point he turned around and looked through his rifle and could see a subject carrying a long gun in a vertical position from the sunroom into the house. Once Officer Beattie had returned to his original position and confirmed the other two officers were okay, he again took a prone position. While in that position he heard Officer Van Laanen broadcast over the radio the subject was coming back, and Officer Beattie heard a single gunshot. Officer Beattie described that gunshot as different in sound from the first three gunshots he had heard. He stated the gunshot was much louder than the first three, describing the first three as sounding “muffled,” as if they were coming from inside the house. Officer Beattie stated he could tell that gunshot came from the area of Officer Van Laanen and Officer Gensrick, southwest of Officer Beattie.

Officer Beattie stated he never saw the subject come outside, nor did he see the subject drop to the floor, but he heard Officer Van Laanen broadcast over the radio, “One shot fired, subject down, subject out of view.” Officer Beattie stated after hearing that he eventually walked south to the field and took a position behind the west pole building. He stated he could see the sunroom and a window that had been opened from that location. Officer Beattie stated other officers arrived and discussed whether or not to make entry and shortly after he was relieved from his position by Det. Wegner. Officer Beattie stated he returned to the intersection of West Bonniwell Road and Riverland Road and “dropped” his tactical vest, tactical helmet, and rifle, which were secured in the rear of a detective vehicle.

Officer Beattie stated he was transported to Crossroads Church by Det. Cory Polishinski and then transported back to the MUPD, also by Det. Polishinski.

Throughout the interview, Officer Beattie added notations that depicted his locations throughout the incident to a Google Maps printout of the area of 3119 West Bonniwell Road. A copy of that map with his notations was attached to this report.

At the end of the interview, S/A Jones confirmed with Officer Beattie he was not injured and that he had not viewed any body camera footage prior to his interview.

The interview concluded at approximately 2:01 p.m.

REPORT REVIEW

On 05/31/2023, at approximately 10:00 a.m., S/A Jones met with Officer Beattie and Attorney Rettko and reviewed this report for accuracy. Officer Beattie and Attorney Rettko found the report to be an accurate representation of Officer Beattie’s recollection of the events that occurred on 05/17/2023.

On Friday, May 19, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice (WI DOJ), Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) Special Agent (SA) Shannon Jones requested that SA Christina McNichol contact citizen [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]) of [REDACTED], Mequon. [REDACTED] contacted the WI DOJ main telephone line and requested to speak with someone regarding the Officer Involved Critical Incident investigation that occurred a few days earlier in Mequon. [REDACTED] indicated that he had background information regarding a possible motive for the decedent, whom SA McNichol knew to be Pietro La Licata.

SA McNichol contacted [REDACTED] via his cellular telephone number of 262-[REDACTED] on May 19th at approximately 4:15PM. SAs McNichol and Amy Templin also met with [REDACTED] in person on [REDACTED] at his Mequon home on May 23 at approximately 11:00AM. During the course of those two conversations, [REDACTED] stated he'd had an encounter with the decedent related to this investigation and he wanted to share the incident with investigators. Although he could not recall exactly when, [REDACTED] stated that he once went to the area of the decedent's home for the purpose of taking photographs of ongoing flooding occurring in the Milwaukee River (which is located just East of the decedent's home). [REDACTED] estimated this occurred 2-3 years ago in the early spring (March to April time frame). While in the area of the decedent's home, [REDACTED] observed a large buck and decided to try and obtain a picture of it, so he followed the buck up a driveway and towards the river a ways before turning around to walk back to his vehicle. [REDACTED] said he was then confronted by a male in the driveway holding an AR-15 type rifle who was irate over the fact [REDACTED] was on his property. [REDACTED] stated he attempted to diffuse the situation by working to befriend the male, and told the man he loved guns. The man ultimately invited [REDACTED] into his home and showed [REDACTED] a closet he had outfitted such that it was equipped like a gun storage cabinet, with hardware and shelving to store firearms. [REDACTED] recalled seeing 3-4 long guns in the lower part of the closet, 5-6 handguns on top, plus a concealed area (visible by removing screws from the handgun storage area and lifting a shelf, then looking down into a compartment) that contained an additional 7-8 long guns. [REDACTED] also observed a large amount of firearms ammunition, estimating [REDACTED] had 1,500 - 2,000 rounds. The male told [REDACTED] he was part of some firearms training related group in the Oostburg area, and he was going to take a bunch of people up there for training.

[REDACTED] described being concerned because the male subject would sometimes seem "fine" during their conversation, but at other times, he was not. SA McNichol asked Meucci what he meant by that, and [REDACTED] said the subject would be speaking normally about something, in a pleasant tone and in a manner which made sense, then he would suddenly get very upset and yell something like, "I'll kill the motherfuckers!" [REDACTED] said the male would then return back to the conversation in a normal tone. Meucci also recalled the subject saying he was highly distrustful of the police and was going to put bulletproof glass on all his windows.

A few days after [REDACTED] was at this subject's house, he said he saw an advertisement for a tipline with an 800 number that he believed went to Homeland Security Investigations (HSI). [REDACTED] felt he should tell someone about the male's extensive firearms and ammunition collection, along with his plan to train a group of people in firearms use. [REDACTED] related to SA McNichol that he

called this number twice; the first time, he spoke with someone who was not helpful and told [REDACTED] there really was nothing he could do. The second time, [REDACTED] spoke with a gentleman who told [REDACTED] he lived in the area and would stop by and check the residence, which Meucci told me was at the address 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd., Mequon. [REDACTED] could not recall the name of the agent, but thought it may have been "Frances." SA McNichol subsequently contacted HSI and had email communication with Criminal Analyst Kimberly McDonough, who told her that HSI had no record of any tips or complaints on Pietro La Licata. Likewise, the only record they had of [REDACTED] related to his past international travel.

During her second contact with [REDACTED], SA McNichol showed [REDACTED] a photograph of La Licata, but [REDACTED] did not recognize him. However, SA McNichol also showed [REDACTED] a street view image from Google Maps on her cellular telephone, and [REDACTED] confirmed the easternmost driveway at 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd. was the driveway in which he first encountered the male subject with the long gun. [REDACTED] also told SA McNichol he was certain the male he interacted with that day was La Licata because he had since met some of La Licata's family out and about in the community. [REDACTED] also told SA McNichol he believed La Licata's ex-wife was named "[REDACTED]," his granddaughter (who was deaf and approximately 12-13 years old at the time) was named "[REDACTED]." Finally, [REDACTED] recalled learning La Licata's birthday was in April, which he remembered because his own birthday is also in April so the pair had discussed it.

On May 17, 2023, S/A Neil McGrath telephonically contacted Ozaukee County Department of Human Services Adult Protective Services Case Worker Katie McCormick and confirmed that McCormick did open a case on Pietro La Licata. McCormick stated she had conducted a home visit on La Licata in April 2023. S/A McGrath informed McCormick that there had been an officer involved shooting incident at La Licata's residence and La Licata was deceased. S/A McGrath explained that DCI was conducting an investigation into the incident and arranged to meet with McCormick at a later date. S/A McGrath also exchanged email contact information with McCormick.

On May 23, 2023, at approximately 12:34 p.m., S/A McGrath and S/A Kadi Walusay were contacted by McCormick by phone. S/A McGrath had previously arranged that day to conduct a telephonic interview with McCormick, rather than meet in person. McCormick advised that Aging and Disability Resource Center Supervisor Kay-Ella Dee was also present with McCormick on the telephone call.

S/A McGrath asked McCormick to describe her contact with La Licata and the history that led up to it. McCormick provided the following information:

On April 17, 2023, McCormick received a referral on La Licata from three different people who had called in. One was a Mequon Police Officer and the other two were neighbors of La Licata. All three had concerns about La Licata becoming agitated, shooting guns at night, possibly having dementia and being a danger to himself and others. Because of the three calls that came in and the nature of the case, it was given the highest priority and McCormick made an in person visit to La Licata that same day.

Prior to going to the house, La Licata met with Officer Gensrick approximately ¼ mile east of La Licata's residence. Officer Gensrick had previously called in his concerns with Human Services due to his prior contact with La Licata and conversations with La Licata's neighbors. McCormick and Officer Gensrick discussed possible safety concerns regarding McCormick visiting La Licata's house. Officer Gensrick described his contact and stated that even though La Licata did have firearms in the residence, he was welcoming and non-threatening. Based on this information, McCormick determined she was comfortable doing the home visit herself.

McCormick went to the residence and had contact with La Licata. At first, La Licata was hesitant, however after she explained what she at the residence for and what her job was, he allowed her in. La Licata stated he had recently made some changes to his will and his financial advisor asked him to have a competency exam. La Licata stated he had three meetings at his home and was found competent by the assessor.

La Licata showed McCormick around his home. He appeared oriented and alert and McCormick could see no emergent concerns or indications that he was a threat throughout her time at the residence. She did notice rifles in several rooms of his home. She stated that each of the

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bedrooms had a rifle by the window. La Licata stated the rifles were for scaring deer from eating his bushes. He demonstrated by opening a window and showing a small opening in the storm window where he could point the gun through and shoot the ground. La Licata stated he never shot at the deer and only shot into the ground.

La Licata did not bring up any issues or ongoing disputes with his neighbors, other than when displaying his security monitoring system to McCormick, there was a camera pointed toward the neighbor's house to his [REDACTED] and La Licata stated he did not like him much.

McCormick provided La Licata with her business card at the end of her visit and told La Licata that she would follow up with him. La Licata was agreeable to McCormick coming to his residence again.

Following the visit, McCormick had telephone contact with La Licata's nephew "[REDACTED]" who stated he spoke to his uncle regularly and had had no concerns regarding his uncle's well-being. [REDACTED] provided McCormick with the name of the assessment evaluator La Licata had mentioned previously, Amy Baumle who was hired by Richmond Investments. McCormick contacted Baumle at telephone number (262) [REDACTED] and confirmed Baumle did not have concerns about La Licata's mental state.

McCormick stated she had planned on conducting a follow up visit with La Licata, however had been unable to due to scheduling conflicts. She planned on visiting him in the coming weeks prior to finding out he was deceased.

S/A McGrath thanked McCormick for the information she provided and the interview was concluded at approximately 12:51 p.m.

The author and the Wisconsin State Patrol reserve the right to conduct a more extensive analysis of the available material on a later date as necessity dictates.

REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE:

On May 17th, 2023, at approximately 09:07 pm, the Wisconsin State Patrol – Southeast Region Dispatch contacted me via phone. I was requested to respond to an officer- involved shooting scene located at 3119 W Bonniwell Drive in the City of Mequon. Upon arrival, I was briefed by Special Agent (SA) Jake Jansky from the Wisconsin Department of Justice – Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI). It was determined that my involvement would be limited to forensically map the scene.

INVOLVEMENT AT THE SCENE:

I documented the scene and residual evidence using a Trimble SX10 Total Station (Figure 1). This device is an electronic survey instrument that is composed of a theodolite (angle measuring system), an EDM (electronic distance measuring) system, a data collector and a prism. The Trimble SX10 is a robotic total station with prismless capabilities, known as direct reflex technology. Additionally, the SX10 has a detached data collector that communicates with the machine using radio technology, which allows the operator to collect data alone. The theodolite and EDM system then record the angle and distance to the prism. The recorded data is stored electronically and later downloaded for processing. Computer software generates Cartesian coordinate data that is transferred into Computer Aided Drawing (CAD) software, where a scaled diagram is completed.

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at approximately 7:00 pm, Special Agent (SA) Shannon D. Jones of the Wisconsin (WI) Department of Justice (DOJ) – Division of Criminal Justice (DCI) was advised of an Officer Involved Shooting in Mequon, Wisconsin (WI). SA Jones was informed of the incident via email and was later directed via phone call to respond to the crime scene located at 3119 W. Bonniwell Road, Mequon, WI.

Upon SA Jones' arrival, he was informed that the law enforcement officers that were involved were Mequon Police Department (MUPD) Patrol Officer (PO) William Van Laanen, Mequon Police Department (MUPD) Patrol Officer (PO) Brian Gensrick, and Mequon Police Department (MUPD) Patrol Officer (PO) Steven Beattie.

SA Jones was later informed that he would conduct the interview of Mequon Police Department (MUPD) Patrol Officer (PO) William Van Laanen.

INTERVIEW OF PATROL OFFICER WILLIAM VAN LAANEN

On Monday, May 22, 2023, at approximately 10:20 am, SA Jones and Special Agent (SA) Ann Shaw conducted an interview of PO Van Laanen. This interview took place within the conference room of the WI DOJ-DCI Milwaukee Field Office located at [REDACTED], Brookfield, WI.

SA Jones advised PO Van Laanen that he was not compelled to provide a statement regarding the incident and that the statement had to be voluntary. PO Van Laanen indicated he would provide SA Jones and SA Shaw with a statement. He also noted that he had not viewed any body worn camera footage regarding this incident. Lastly, PO Van Laanen stated he did not want this interview recorded.

Present for the interview on behalf of PO Van Laanen was Attorney William R. Rettko.

BACKGROUND AND TRAINING

PO Van Laanen is currently employed with the Mequon Police Department (MUPD) located at 11300 N. Buntrock Ave, Mequon, WI. He is employed with MUPD as a Patrol Officer. He was appointed to MUPD on Monday, February 14, 2022. PO Van Laanen has the Employee Number [REDACTED] and the Call Number 935.

The date of this incident, PO Van Laanen had an equipment / weapons inspection completed by Special Agents from WI DOJ-DCI. A separate report was filed regarding same.

PO Van Laanen started his law enforcement career with the Milwaukee Police Department (MPD). He worked for MPD in the capacity of a Patrol Officer from December 2015 till January

2022. Of note, he completed his law enforcement certification with MPD Training Academy (December 2015 till May 2016).

PO Van Laanen has also earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice in 2014 from University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee. He has also started his master's degree in Criminal Justice with the University of Wisconsin – Platteville.

PO Van Laanen has never been a member of the Armed Forces.

PO Van Laanen is currently assigned to the [REDACTED] Shift ([REDACTED] till [REDACTED]) with MUPD. He noted that the squad areas vary from day to day, but that they usually know their assigned areas a week or so in advance. PO Van Laanen indicated he works a [REDACTED] ([REDACTED] days on / [REDACTED] days off – [REDACTED] days on / [REDACTED] days off) workday rotational schedule. The date of this incident was the [REDACTED] workday of his [REDACTED] days.

DAY PRIOR TO THE INCIDENT

SA Jones questioned PO Van Laanen regarding Tuesday, May 16, 2023. PO Van Laanen stated he worked a full shift on that date. He added that the only call for service that was out of the norm was a Domestic Violence call. PO Van Laanen stated that the call for service was on the east side of the City of Mequon. The call was at St. Mary's Hospital – Ozaukee located at 13111 N Port Washington Road, Mequon, WI. PO Van Laanen noted how there was an arrest made and that he had to have the subject medically cleared on scene.

PO Van Laanen did not work any overtime on Tuesday, May 16, 2023.

PO Van Laanen completed his tour and went home. He then let his dogs out. He then watched television and went to sleep between 1:30 am – 2:00 am. He had no alcohol or medication.

DAY OF THE INCIDENT

PO Van Laanen woke up on Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at approximately 11:00 am. He relaxed at home till approximately 3:00 pm and then left for work. PO Van Laanen noted that the day's weather was cloudy and in the 50's. He arrived at work at approximately 3:10 pm.

PO Van Laanen informed SA Jones and SA Shaw that upon his arrival at work, he observed law enforcement personnel (Detectives) running from MUPD towards their squads. He indicated that he also overheard someone stating, "Shots fired on Bonniwell".

PO Van Laanen quickly entered MUPD and got dressed for work. He changed from his personal clothing to his full MUPD issued uniform. He then obtained his taser and body worn camera. PO Van Laanen then checked out MUPD Squad #3.

INITIAL RESPONSE

PO Van Laanen entered his squad and heard via the police radio that squads were responding to a staging area at the Crossroads Church located at 6031 W Chapel Hill Road, Mequon, WI. He then informed the dispatcher that he would be signing on early. PO Van Laanen signed into the system and responded to the Crossroads Church. He noted how when he was enroute, there was a radio transmission where squads were being designated for traffic control.

PO Van Laanen responded quickly to the Crossroads Church parking lot. He noted that this location was designated as a staging area to determine a plan of action for the call for service. Upon his arrival, he observed squads and law enforcement personnel from the county and MUPD. Also present were Mequon Fire Department personnel.

PO Van Laanen walked up to join the personnel and attempted to determine what was going on. He noted how he was able to determine from the talks what all had transpired. SA Jones requested PO Van Laanen to explain his understanding of what transpired. PO Van Laanen stated that an elderly male got into a dispute with his neighbor and fired a round at the neighbor. He added that the elderly male reportedly has 30 to 40 guns in the residence.

PO Van Laanen reported that all vehicles left in a caravan heading northbound on Green Bay Road. He stated that his squad was second in the caravan and that he blocked the traffic lane for the caravan so that they could all proceed North together. There were a total of five (5) or six (6) squads ahead of him. PO Van Laanen then joined in on the caravan as the last vehicle and synched his body worn camera with the system.

SCENE RESPONSE

The caravan proceeded North on N. Green Bay Road to W. Bonniwell Road. They then went East on W. Bonniwell Road. PO Van Laanen noted how he stopped his vehicle just to the West of the intersection of N. Riverland Road and W. Bonniwell Road, along the south side of Bonniwell Road facing East.

PO Van Laanen stated he unlocked his squad rifle and exited the squad with the rifle in hand. He explained how as he proceeded to walk away from his squad, the tenant (female) at the residence that he was parked in front of exited her residence to determine what was going on. She stated that she had heard an argument and a gunshot. She inquired as to if she should go inside her residence. PO Van Laanen informed the female that she should go back into her residence. The female then questioned as to if it was Pietro.

PO Van Laanen never answered the female, but indicated he did recall the name from the parking lot briefing and the notes in the call log. He stated he did tell the female to please go back inside her home.

PO Van Laanen then met up with MUPD Patrol Officer (PO) Stephanie Vasos and MUPD Patrol Officer (PO) Austin Boinski. They held a discussion regarding rear containment for the address of 3119 W. Bonniwell Road. PO Van Laanen was informed that the rear containment would be MUPD PO Beattie. PO Van Laanen then volunteered to go along with PO Beattie for the rear containment and they walked together to the South past a barn to a clearing / field area. They then proceeded to the East in the clearing / field area along the tree line.

PO Van Laanen explained how they arrived near the West boundary line of the 3119 W. Bonniwell Road and at this location was a tree line that proceeded South to North. At this location, PO Beattie questioned PO Van Laanen as to if the target residence was to the Northeast of their location (in eyesight). PO Van Laanen noted how he confirmed the location as being 3119 W. Bonniwell Road via Google Maps on his squad cellular phone.

PO Van Laanen added that he actually needed confirmation because he had previously been to an address located to the East of 3119 W. Bonniwell Road. On that call for service, there was an elderly male in possession of firearms as well. From the rear of the locations, PO Van Laanen noted he could not tell for certainty if he was familiar with the location. As indicated above, he was able to confirm the location that was in their eyesight was 3119 W. Bonniwell Road and not a location he had been to in the past.

PO Van Laanen informed SA Jones and SA Shaw that he and PO Beattie continued to walk East. He stopped at a large tree that was just to the East of the above-described South to North tree

line. PO Van Laanen noted how PO Beattie continued walking East and took up a position near the rear of an outbuilding.

PO Van Laanen next confirmed that they were to the rear of the correct location via police radio. He did this by describing the residence and received confirmation that he and PO Beattie were at the rear of the correct residence, 3119 W. Bonniwell Road. PO Van Laanen received more confirmation when he observed the Ozaukee County Drone flying over the rear of the residence and just to the North of their location.

He then described the position of cover that he utilized. PO Van Laanen noted that this was a large tree and he believed that the tree would withstand / protect him from fired projectiles. He informed SA Jones and SA Shaw that he chose this tree because he the intel he had received was that the subject was armed. The position / location selected by PO Van Laanen also provided him with clear observation of the south side and west side of the residence. He noted that if anyone were to exit the location in these areas, he could clearly observe them.

PO Van Laanen had not been provided any description of the subject from the residence of 3119 W. Bonniwell Road, other than the subject being an elderly male, the subject's name, and date of birth. This information was provided in the call log.

PO Beattie then moved out of sight of PO Van Laanen. PO Beattie moved to the East and then Northeast along the side of another outbuilding. They remained in these separate locations for approximately 15 to 20 minutes.

PO Van Laanen then informed SA Jones and SA Shaw that he observed a subject in the sunroom of the residence. The sunroom was the Southwest room of the address of 3119 W. Bonniwell Road. He provided SA Jones and SA Shaw the description that he transmitted via the police radio. He related:

White Hair
Blue Shirt
Khaki Pants
Possible Drinking
No Firearm Observed at This Time

PO Van Laanen then inquired as to if there should be anyone else in the residence. He stated he was informed via radio transmissions that the subject should be in the residence alone with a dog. The subject then walked back to the North into the residence and out of sight.

After a period of time, PO Van Laanen stated that there was now a dog in the rear yard barking. He added that there was someone in the sunroom area looking out at the dark in the rear yard

area. PO Van Laanen informed SA Jones and SA Shaw that his vision of the subject was partially blocked by the tree line branches, but that he could make out that the subject had on a blue shirt and khaki pants.

The subject later moved to a location to open the door for the dog and PO Van Laanen stated he was then able to observe that the subject was the same individual he had earlier observed in the sunroom area. The subject had nothing in his hands at this point. The subject then went back out of the line of sight and returned to the interior of the residence. PO Van Laanen noted how he transmitted all the actions of the subject via the police radio.

Command then inquired via radio transmission if PO Van Laanen could yell out to the subject that he was from Mequon Police Department. PO Van Laanen informed Command that he could not. He then explained to SA Jones and SA Shaw that he had replied that he could not because he believed he was approximately 60 yards South of the sunroom. He added that the subject was also inside the sunroom and possibly inside the residence. This added some additional yards.

PO Van Laanen stated he then asked Command if he should move closer (North) into the South to North tree line to attempt to make contact with the subject as needed. PO Van Laanen was directed to not move closer.

After a period of time, PO Van Laanen was informed that MUPD Patrol Officer (PO) Brian Gensrick would be responding to his location. PO Gensrick eventually arrives at PO Van Laanen's location with a shield in hand. He then updated PO Gensrick on what all had recently transpired. This occurred over a period of time.

PO Van Laanen stated that out of the blue, the subject just appeared in the sunroom. He noted that he subject had the white hair with a blue shirt and khaki pants on. PO Van Laanen observed the subject walking towards the South window area of the sunroom. The subject also appeared to have in his possession a long gun. PO Van Laanen observed this through his regular vision. He also transmitted this information to Command via the police radio.

PO Van Laanen then observed the subject in the sunroom South window and raising the long gun in his direction pointing to the South. PO Van Laanen responded by ducking down for cover to the rear of the tree he was near. He then heard three (3) shots emanating from the North. He then described the sequence in the following manner:

First Shot – Heard objects (projectiles) striking the tree he was to the rear of for cover.

Pause Two (2) to Three (3) Seconds

Second Shot- Heard objects (projectiles) striking the tree he was to the rear of for cover.

PO Gensrick transmitted via police radio, "Shots Fired at Police!"

Pause Two (2) to Three (3) Seconds

Third Shot - Heard objects (projectiles) striking the tree he was to the rear of for cover.

PO Gensrick yelled out, "Pietro! It's the Mequon Police Department!"

PO Van Laanen inquired of PO Gensrick as to if he could see the subject via the window of the shield and PO Gensrick stated he could not.

PO Van Laanen next raised his rifle and placed it in a "U" section of the tree for support and cover. He noted he could see into the sunroom at this point. He then radioed Command and inquired as to if the subject returns to the sunroom with the long gun and posed a threat of deadly force, could he take the shot. Before receiving a response, the subject reappeared in the sunroom area causing PO Van Laanen to get off the radio.

PO Van Laanen informed SA Jones and SA Shaw that the subject then returned to the window of the sunroom. The subject was again armed with a long gun. The subject then raised the weapon and pointed it to the South in the direction of PO Van Laanen and PO Gensrick.

PO Van Laanen stated he responded by shooting his rifle one (1) time. He indicated he shot because he believed the subject was going to shoot at them again and he feared for his safety / life and the safety / life of PO Gensrick. PO Van Laanen noted that the subject was facing them directly while raising the long gun and had already previously fired at them three (3) times.

PO Van Laanen informed SA Jones and SA Shaw that after he fired the one (1) shot at the subject, he observed that the subject was down and no longer in sight. He indicated that there was a raised area of the sunroom that the subject had fallen behind and that he did not know if the subject had been struck by gunfire or just awaiting their movement forward.

PO Van Laanen advised Command that he had fired one (1) shot and explained what all transpired. He also informed Command that the subject was down and out of sight. He noted that he and PO Gensrick were okay.

PO Van Laanen stated he and PO Gensrick held their positions until they were relieved. They were taken back to their squads and then to the Crossroads Church parking lot. They were then transported back to MUPD. PO Van Laanen noted that MUPD Sergeant (SGT) Lindsay Graycarek took possession of his squad rifle.

SA Jones and SA Shaw completed the interview of Mequon Police Department (MUPD) Patrol Officer (PO) William Van Laanen on Monday, May 22, 2023, at approximately 11:40 am.

On May 18, 2023 at approximately 12:22am, SA Marlock followed M.E. Warnke as he departed 3119 W. Bonniwell Rd, Mequon, WI to transport La Licata's body. SA Marlock followed M.E. Warnke to the Walworth County Medical Examiner's Office located at 1770 County Rd NN, Elkhorn, WI.

On May 18, 2023 at approximately 1:26am, M.E. Warnke arrived to the Walworth County Medical Examiner's Office. SA Marlock accompanied M.E. Warnke as he removed La Licata's body from the van and transported it into the cooler area of the Medical Examiner's Office. The body bag tag #3384 was verified by SA Marlock and M.E. Warnke as it was placed in the cooler.

Radio transmissions were muffled and SA Jones could not clearly transcribe what was being said on the recording. SA Jones attempted to transcribed what was being said by the recording officer.

Beginning Time: 00:00

00:00 – Depicts the Recording Officer operating a Ford squad and the interior of the vehicle being displayed.

00:15 – Recording Officer begins to drive the squad.

01:35 – Recording Officer was on the phone talking of a previous call in the area and his current response to the staging area.

03:42 – Recording Officer parked his vehicle and exited same. He also retrieved his rifle from the squad prior to exiting the squad. Recording Officer then walked East on Bonniwell Road passing up other parked MUPD Squads and law enforcement personnel. Recording Officer then walked South in a driveway towards a red barn.

04:05 – Recording Officer spoke with a female at the residence and informed her of what was going on. She noted how she had heard someone yell and also heard one (1) shot. Recording Officer asked her to stay inside. He then walked back towards Bonniwell Road and met up with law enforcement personnel standing near parked MUPD Squads.

ACTIVITY:

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, the Wisconsin Department of Justice - Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ-DCI) was requested by the Mequon Police Department (MUPD) to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred in the City of Mequon, Ozaukee County, WI. The initial information provided was that a MUPD police officer discharged their firearm at a subject during an incident. The subject was later identified as Pietro La Licata (hereafter referred to as Pietro), M/U, DOB: [REDACTED] and the incident occurred at a residence at 3119 W Bonniwell Road, Mequon, WI 53097. WI DOJ-DCI Special Agent (SA) Jacob Chihak, along with other WI DOJ-DCI agents, responded to assist with the OICI investigation.

SA Chihak was tasked with examining body worn camera (BWC) and squad camera from incident previously obtained by DCI Digital Forensic Examiner (DFE) Jason Ruff from the Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office (OZSO). Refer to the BWC and squad camera recordings in the Critical Incident DCIR Digital Evidence Folder under this case and labeled 23-3991_1 (Ruff) DFU Response. SGT Ronan deployed what appeared to be a ballistic plate carrier and a squad rifle. The video ended with SGT Ronan, other OZSO deputies, and other officers still standing at the roadblock. 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15:35 – The officers began discussing the statements from the “RP” or reporting person/the complainant. Relayed from someone off camera, the person speaking detailed what the complainant reported. The complainant indicated Pietro had a long gun but was unsure whether it was shotgun or a rifle. The complainant heard a gunshot and the round going past the complainant while the complainant was about 20 feet away from Pietro. The complainant reported when he looked over at Pietro, the gun was pointed at the complainant.

16:26 – Another officer off camera - likely the MUPD detective noted above who spoke to the sons - advised Pietro would not shoot a cop but the other son “would not put it past him”.

16:44 – A female voice – which SA Chihak believed to be SGT Ronan based of the video review – asked whether officers should use a “PA” or a loudspeaker/Megaphone to attempt contact with Pietro. A male voice advised, “He can’t hear,” and, “He’s deaf.” Someone advised they sent Pietro a text but said they were unsure if he could read a text. SGT Ronan asked whether the drone – which was being piloted by another OZSO deputy – had a PA/loudspeaker on it. On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice / Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ/DCI) Special Agents (SA) were requested to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) which occurred at 3119 West Bonniwell Road, Mequon, Wisconsin. The suspect, Pietro La Licata, was fatally shot during the incident. The WI DOJ/DCI was requested to be the lead investigative agency for the OICI.

Forensic Data Processing:

SA Justin Bender completed the forensic data processing of the Trimble SX10 total station data collected by Wisconsin State Patrol (WSP) Trooper Scott Darin at the incident scene on Wednesday, May 17, 2023. Trooper Darin indicated he collected 37 points and moved the total station during the mapping project. When the raw field data was reviewed, Trooper Darin identified that the instrument did not update to the new set-up location, starting with point number 25. Points 25 – 32 and 35 were evidence locations numbered 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12. Points 33 and 34 was La Licata’s body location. Points 36 and 37 was an instrument accuracy confirmation check. **Figure 1** below shows the portion of the forensic mapping log points that needed to be orientated correctly to the rest of the measured points.

- **Trimble Reveal Scaled Scene Diagrams:**

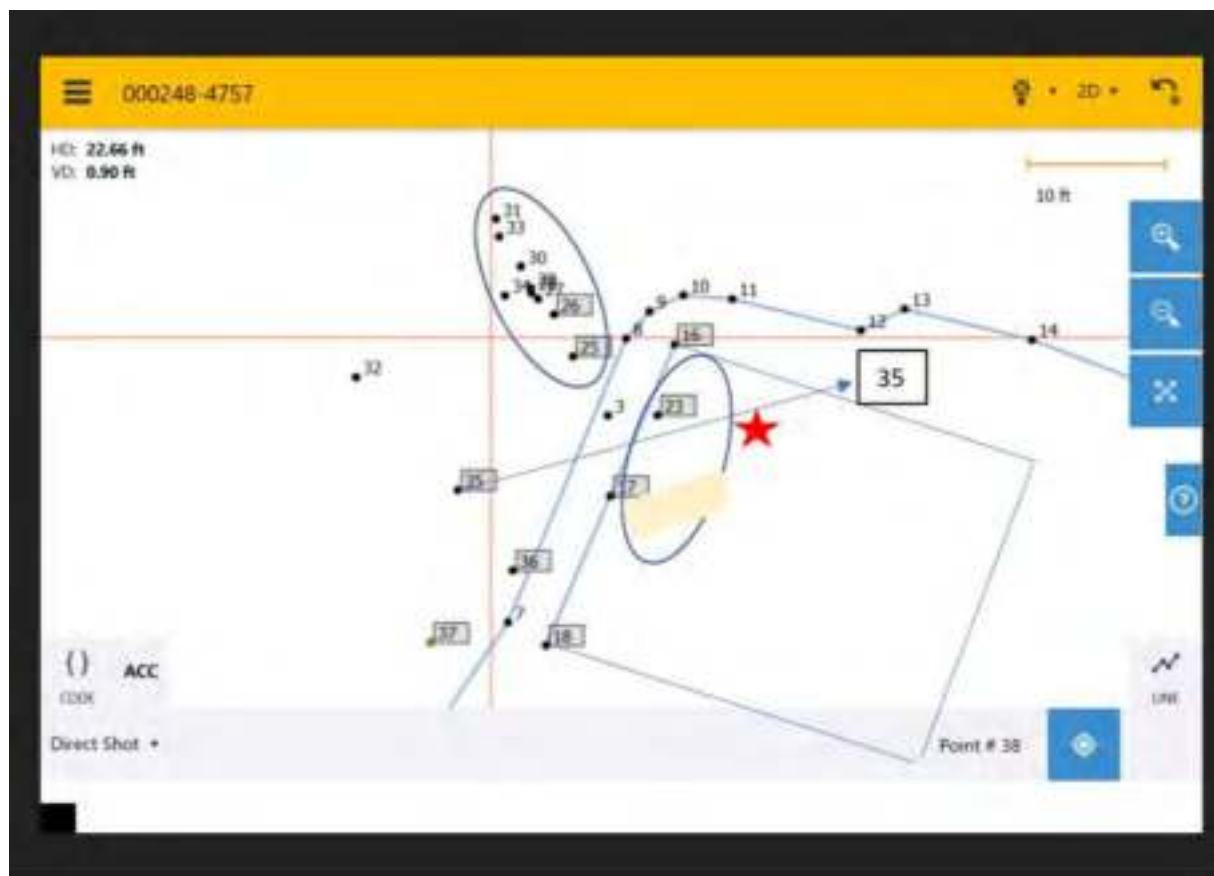


Figure 2 – Trimble Capture Software 2D View Diagram

SA Bender analyzed the forensic mapping data utilizing Trimble Reveal (3D diagramming and analysis software). SA Bender oriented the points identified by Trooper Darin to their approximate locations utilizing Wisconsin State Crime Lab (WSCL) digital photographs and a diagram provided by Trooper Darin (**Figure 2**).

The identified points were rotated (together as a group to maintain their spatial integrity) counterclockwise in reference to the provided diagram. For reference, the blue oval that encompassed most of the points, near the top center of the diagram, was rotated into the blue oval in the rectangle (residence three season room). Point 35 was rotated to align with the bold and outlined 35. The filled in tan rectangle inside the three season room was La Licata's body location. The red star was the location Trooper Darin attempted to move the total station.

02:33 – Another SRT member leaned toward the glass patio door and the glass patio door broke.

02:45 – PO Woepse entered the residence through the broken patio door and called out “police department!” PO Woepse then proceeded to search the residence for any occupants. A male voice called out there was a gun nearby.

08:36 – PO Woepse turned the ballistic shield over to another member of the SRT.

17:46 – A revolver with a light-colored handle was on top of some paper on a coffee table in the living room area of the residence.

26:58 – PO Woepse entered the sunroom. A subject with a silver reflective tarp over him lied on the floor of the sunroom. A subject’s feet pointed toward the northeast/east and the subject’s right lower leg, right foot, and left foot were still visible. There was a long gun about one yard away from the subject’s feet. PO Woepse obtained some equipment (breaching tools) from the armored vehicle and returned to the inside of the residence.

27:32 – As PO Woepse re-entered the sunroom, a second long gun was visible on a windowsill in the sunroom.

31:24 – PO Woepse accompanied other members of the SRT to some outbuilding to search them for occupants. PO Woepse forced entry to one of the outbuildings by using what seemed to be breaching tools.
